

Women's History Month

Every year March is designated Women's History Month by Presidential proclamation. The month is set aside to honor women's contribution in American history.

Women's History Month began as a local celebration in Santa Rosa, California. The Education Task Force of the Sonoma County (California) Commission on the Status of Women planned and executed a "Women's History Week" celebration in 1978. The week of March 8th was selected to correspond with International Women's Day. This week of celebration spread across the country in the following year.

Led by the National Women's History Project (now the National Women's History Alliance) it was successfully lobbied to be recognized nationally. In February 1980, President Jimmy Carter issued the first Presidential Proclamation declaring the Week of March 8th 1980 as National Women's History Week. Congress passed Public Law 100-9, designating March as Women's History Month in 1987.

The theme for Women's History Month in 2021 is "Valent Women of the Vote: Refusing to Be Silenced."

March Speaker

Pam Gumns is **Free The Girls** Director of Strategic Partnerships. **Free The Girls** provides economic empowerment to survivors of sex trafficking. In her current role she works with brands, retailers, and lingerie companies as well as clubs, civic groups, church and faith-based partners and all official FTG drop-off locations. Through the donation of new and returned inventory from businesses and gently used bras from individuals **Free The Girls** is able to provide inventory for a trafficking survivor's micro enterprise. To date over 1.5 million+ bras have been collected! Pam is a native Hoosier recently transplanted to northern California.

Pam will be sharing about FTG and their model, plans for expansion, and ways to be involved.
