

Dear Zontians,

March is Women's History Month. During this month we celebrate Zonta Rose Day on the 8th. It is also a time to reflect and give tribute to the women who have empowered us. Some examples are Alicia Garza-Black, founder of Black Lives Matter; Laverne Cox, Advocate for the LGBT TQ Community; Malala Yousafzai, Advocate for women's education; Greta Thunberg, Climate Change Advocate; Judith Heumann, Disability Rights Activists; Aamika George, Anti-Poverty Activist. At our last meeting, our speaker was Reverend Paul Fleck who was an immigration attorney turned pastor with an emphasis on helping immigrants through the legal process. He spoke to us about the issue of Immigration Customs Enforcement (ICE). The good news was that New York seems to be holding its own. An important piece of information is that there is a significant difference between a judicial warrant and an administrative warrant. A judicial warrant is the federal warrant issued by a judge and must be obeyed, whereas, an administrative warrant is issued by ICE. You do not have to be compliant, but you have the right to ask them to get a judicial warrant before they come back.
