# Pastor Nathan Richards' Message

# "The Heart of True Hospitality"

"One Sabbath, when Jesus went to eat in the house of a prominent Pharisee, he was being carefully watched." At that meal, Jesus noticed how the guests picked the places of honor at the table. So He told them a parable: "When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take the place of honor... But when you are invited, take the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he will say to you, 'Friend, move up to a better place.' For all those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted." (vv. 7–11)

Then Jesus turned to the host and said, "When you give a luncheon or dinner, do not invite your friends, your brothers or sisters, your relatives, or your rich neighbors; if you do, they may invite you back and so you will be repaid. But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed. Although they cannot repay you, you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous." Luke 14:1, 7–14


This passage reminds us that the way of Christ is not the way of status, recognition, or self-importance. Instead, Jesus teaches us that humility leads to honor in God's kingdom, and that true hospitality is found in opening our lives to those who cannot repay us.

As followers of Christ, we are called to reflect His generous love. That means choosing the lower seat, welcoming the overlooked, and serving without expecting anything in return. This is the kind of hospitality that transforms hearts and reveals the heart of God.


So this week, may we ask ourselves: Where can I choose humility? Who can I welcome with no strings attached? Let us be a church known for lifting others up and making room at the table for all.



### RESOURCE CONNECTION & SUPPORT

The Resource Department handles multiple calls a day. The nature and outcome of each call is different. People might be directed to a different or additional resource; asked to call back with more information so BTG can better assess and assist; or BTG might agree to assist financially. BTG often works with other funding sources to fully meet a request that is beyond what BTG can support alone. When other agencies' funds are depleted, BTG must be even more discerning.

Bridging the Gap Outreach:

1. We continue to collaborate with KVCAP to connect individuals and families to their Laundry Card Program. Through this partnership, we can fill 8 slots each month, providing participants with access to clean laundry—a basic but critical need that supports health, dignity, and self-confidence. This ongoing collaboration helps reduce barriers for those facing financial hardship.

2. Sam met with two valuable new resources this month: Sexual Assault Crisis and Support Center and Maine Family Planning Health on Wheels. Both organizations will be excellent additions to our monthly tabling lineup, expanding our ability to connect individuals to critical support and services in the community.

3. Sam attended the 7th Annual Opioid Response Summit on Thursday, July 10, 2025, at the Augusta Civic Center. This annual event gathers leaders from across Maine and the nation to exchange ideas, strategies, and best practices aimed at supporting Mainers impacted by the opioid crisis.

# Upcoming Bridging the Gap Outreach:

1. In September, the Resource Department will represent Bridging the Gap and showcase our programs at two key community events: the City of Waterville's 3rd Annual Community Collaborative: Support and Education at Head of Falls, and the Recovery Friendly Community Collaborative: Support and Education at Head of Falls, and the Recovery Friendly Workplace Resource Fair at the Augusta Civic Center—a meaningful event, especially since Bridging the Gap became a proud member of the Recovery Friendly Workplace initiative in 2024.

2. The Resource Department will also be participating in the United Way's Impact2032

Summit on October 28th. This important event brings together community leaders and partners to advance shared goals in health, education, and financial stability, creating lasting, positive change for Kennebec County. Bridging the Gap is thrilled to be part of this collective vision.
