



#### From Rev. Richards

In the Christian sense, love is not primarily an emotion but an act of the will. When Jesus tells us to love our neighbors, he is not telling us to love them by responding to them with a warm, cozy, emotional feeling. We can produce a warm, cozy, emotional feeling on demand about as easy as we can a yawn or a sneeze. To the contrary, what I think Jesus is telling us is to love our neighbors deliberately in the sense that we are willing to work for their well-being... even if it means sacrificing our own well-being in the end. As Regina Clarinda puts it, "Love is the joy we get from God when we put (God's) benefit and the benefit of another person before our own."

# Sit Walk Stand: Living Out Your Identity in Christ in a Sexualized Culture

Ted Shimer Description

A study in the book of Ephesians about how to sit, walk and stand in our identity in Christ. In Sit, Paul unpacks a believer's position in Christ. In walk, Paul exhorts the Ephesians to live in a manner worthy of their high calling. In stand, believers are instructed to prepare for the enemy's attacks. The Ephesians lived in a sexualized culture which has great application for today's believer in a pornified world.

Ted Shimer guides us through this six-session series looking at the practical implications of our union with Christ: we are in Christ and Christ is in us. Paul not only explains the truths about our position in Christ but he gives practical steps to make living out our identity in Christ a lifestyle.


