Is my dog considered a puppy?

Puppies are still developing their routines, and being away from home can sometimes throw them off track. Even those who are house trained may have accidents in a new environment, especially when adjusting to a different schedule. To keep them comfortable and set them up for success, we provide extra potty breaks and, when needed, use crating to reinforce good habits. Puppies also require more supervision, gentle redirection, and structured rest to help them settle in. Because of the additional care and attention they need, we include a small extra charge to ensure they receive the best possible experience while boarding. If your puppy does not require extra care and attention then you will be refunded the puppy fee at pick-up

What are high needs breeds?

1. Dogs with Special Grooming Needs

Some breeds require frequent brushing, bathing, or coat maintenance, which adds to your workload.

- **Doodles (Goldendoodles, Labradoodles, Bernedoodles)** – Prone to matting if not brushed daily.
 - **Shih Tzus & Maltese** – Long coats need daily care.
- **Huskies & Malamutes** – Heavy shedders with seasonal blowouts.

2. High-Energy/Working Breeds

These dogs need extensive exercise and mental stimulation to avoid destructive behavior.

- **Border Collies & Australian Shepherds** – Extremely intelligent and active, requiring structured activities.
- **Belgian Malinois & German Shepherds** – High-drive dogs that need serious engagement.
- **Jack Russell Terriers & Beagles** – Small but incredibly energetic and prone to escaping.

3. Severe mobility issues, heavily medicated, or highly specialized diets

Older or sick dogs may require important medication, significant mobility assistance, or highly specialized diets.

- **Giant breeds (Great Danes, Mastiffs, St. Bernards)** – Prone to joint issues and need assistance standing/moving.
 - **Diabetic dogs** – Require insulin injections on schedule.
 - **Epileptic dogs** – Need monitoring for seizures.

4. Aggressive or Severely Anxious Dogs

Dogs with behavioral issues require experienced handling and separate spaces.

- **Dogs with separation anxiety** – Can be destructive and require constant supervision.
 - **Food/toy-aggressive dogs** – Need to be separated from other boarders.
- **Unneutered males or in-heat females** – Require extra precautions and isolation.

5. Escape Artists or High-Prey Drive Dogs

Dogs that jump fences, dig, or chase small animals can be a liability.

- **Siberian Huskies** – Known escape artists requiring secure enclosures.
- **Dobermans & German Shepherds** – Can clear high fences with ease.
- **Sighthounds (Greyhounds, Whippets, Salukis)** – High prey drive, hard to recall.
