If passed, this legislation would officially recognize individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities as a Medically Underserved Population, opening doors to expanded healthcare access and addressing long-standing disparities in areas such as preventive care, chronic condition management, and dental services.

At Gateway, we remain committed to staying informed and proactive in response to these changes, ensuring that our services remain resilient, inclusive, and empowering.

Thank you for being part of our journey. Your support, collaboration, and shared vision continue to make Gateway a place where individuals thrive and communities grow stronger.




