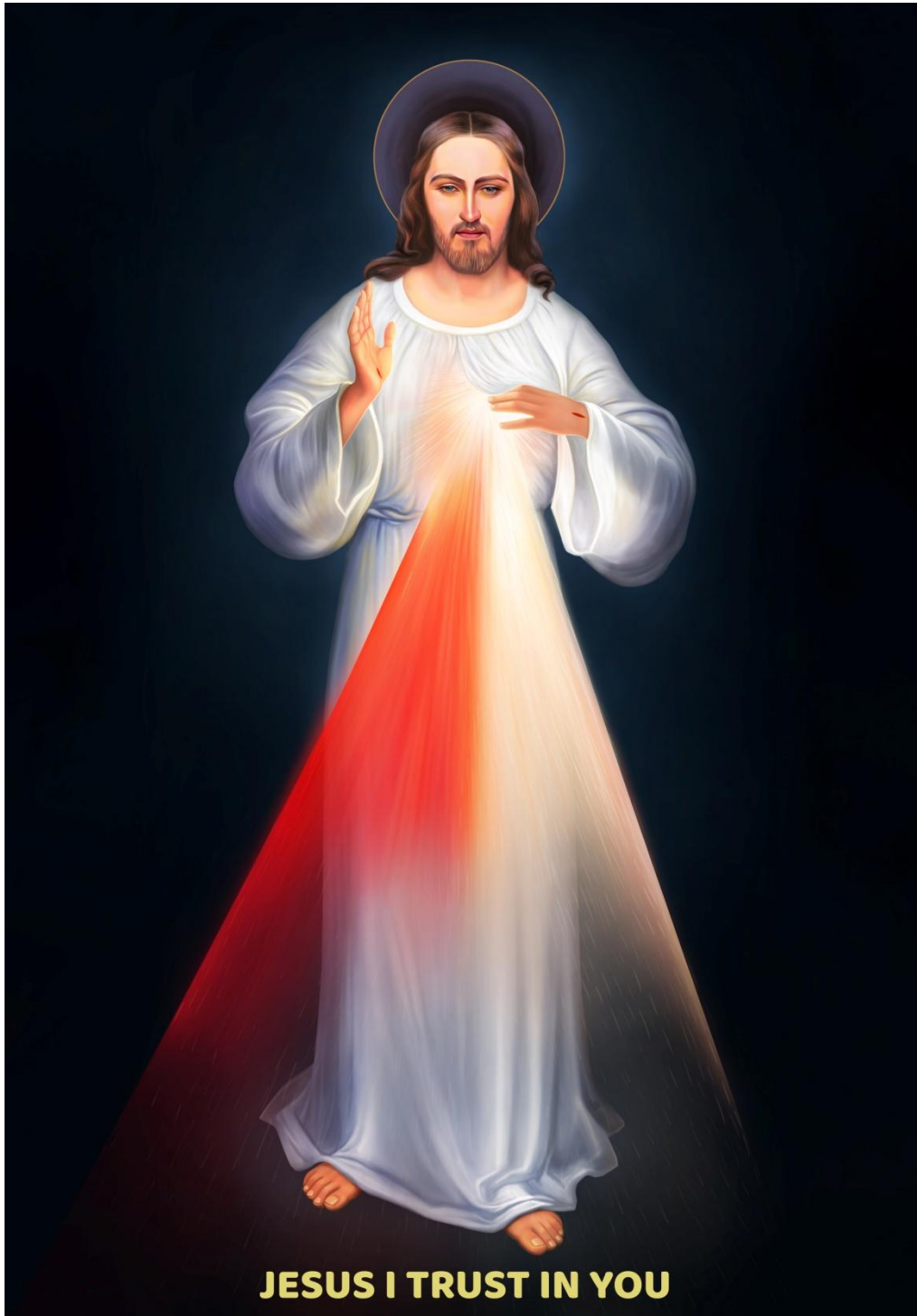

enter every trembling heart.

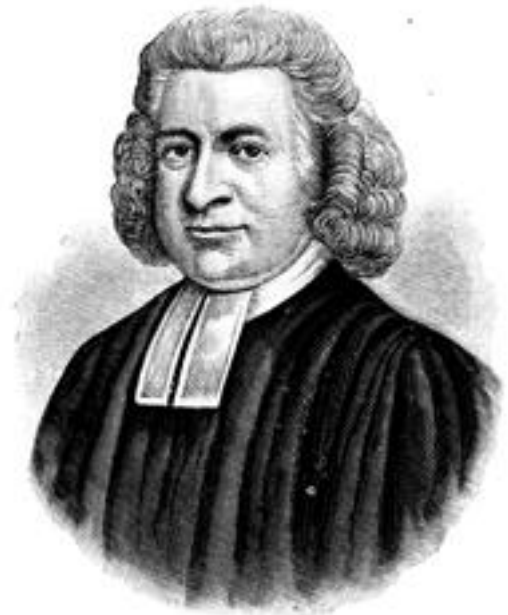
Breathe, O breathe Thy loving Spirit

Divine Mercy, fount gushing forth from the mystery of the most Blessed Trinity

Divine Mercy, unfathomable by any intellect, human or angelic

Divine Mercy, from which wells forth all life and happiness

Divine Mercy, encompassing the whole universe

Divine Mercy, source of miracles and wonders
Divine Mercy, descending to Earth in the Person of the Incarnate Word
Divine Mercy, which flowed out from the open wound of the Heart of Jesus
Divine Mercy, enclosed in the Heart of Jesus for us and all sinners
Divine Mercy, unfathomed in the institution of the Sacred Heart
Divine Mercy, in the founding of the Holy Church

The Chaplet of the Divine Mercy

We pray together: You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty yourself upon us.

Repeat three times: O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You.

Recite on the beads of the Rosary:

- 1. The Lord's Prayer**
- 2. Hail Mary**
- 3. The Apostles' Creed**



On the Our Father beads, we pray:

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of your dearly beloved Son, our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

On the Hail Mary beads, we pray:

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, **(R)** have mercy on us and the whole world.

After the five decades, pray three times:

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and the whole world.

Prayer for Cleansing and Pardon

Recitation of Psalm 51, as there are many indulgences attached to this psalm.

To the leader. A Psalm of David, when the prophet Nathan came to him, after David had committed a serious sin with Bathsheba.

¹Have mercy on me, O God,
according to your steadfast love;
according to your abundant mercy
blot out my transgressions.

²Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity,
and cleanse me from my sin.

³For I know my transgressions,
and my sin is ever before me.

⁴Against you, you alone, have I sinned,
and done what is evil in your sight,
so that you are justified in your sentence
and blameless when you pass judgement.

⁵Indeed, I was born guilty,
a sinner when my mother conceived me.

⁶You desire truth in the inward being;
therefore teach me wisdom in my secret heart.

⁷Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean;
wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.

⁸Let me hear joy and gladness;
let the bones that you have crushed rejoice.

⁹Hide your face from my sins,
and blot out all my iniquities.

¹⁰Create in me a clean heart, O God,
and put a new and right spirit within me.

¹¹Do not cast me away from your presence,
and do not take your holy spirit from me.

¹²Restore to me the joy of your salvation,
and sustain in me a willing spirit.

¹³Then I will teach transgressors your ways,
and sinners will return to you.

¹⁴Deliver me from bloodshed, O God,
O God of my salvation,
and my tongue will sing aloud of your deliverance.

¹⁵O Lord, open my lips,
and my mouth will declare your praise.

¹⁶For you have no delight in sacrifice;
if I were to give a burnt-offering, you would not be pleased.

¹⁷The sacrifice acceptable to God is a broken spirit;
a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.

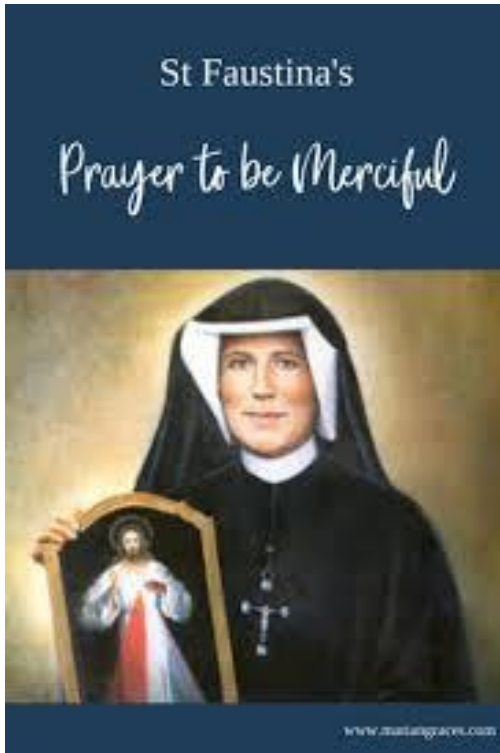
¹⁸Do good to Zion in your good pleasure;
rebuild the walls of Jerusalem,

¹⁹then you will delight in right sacrifices,
in burnt-offerings and whole burnt-offerings;
then bulls will be offered on your altar.

Help me Jesus that what I ask of You, I will give to others in word and deed

Help me O Lord, that my eyes will be merciful, so that I may never suspect or judge others but always look for what is beautiful and good in other people. Help me that my ears may be merciful, so that I may give heed to others' needs and not be indifferent to their pain.

Help me o Lord that my tongue will be merciful, so that I should never speak wrongly of others but have a word of comfort and forgiveness for all.

Help me O Lord that my hands may be merciful and filled with good deeds so

that I may do only good to others and always try to take upon myself the more difficult tasks.

Help me O lord that my feet will be merciful, so that I may hurry to assist others, overcoming my own fatigue and weariness contemplating your love and mercy.

Help me O Lord to forgive and forget. This is your greatest gift to me, and should be mine for your sake, to all who offend me.

Closing Prayer

Eternal God, in whom Mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase your Mercy in us, that in difficult moments, we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your Holy Will, which is Love and Mercy itself. Amen.
