MINUTES FOR AUGUST 12, 2016

SWRI LIBRARY - 6220 CULEBRA ROAD
SAN ANTONIO, TX 78238

I. CALL MEETING TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order at approximately 10:07 a.m. by the LEPC Vice Chairman Walt Daugherty. Those in attendance introduced themselves.

II. ATTENDANCE:

III. CITIZENS TO BE HEARD:

IV. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Minutes of the July 8, 2016 meeting were tabled until September meeting for review.

V. FINANCIAL REPORT:

John Hageman provided the information on the financial statement that he created as of July 24, 2016. A copy of the full financial report was emailed out and is attached. One minor correction was made increasing the balance by \$0.03. To summarize, there was approximately \$27 in interest income, no contributions made, no outstanding debts, and a refund submitted by Patrick Lewis (\$268.94) and a refund submitted by William Johnston (\$942.03) for the International Hazmat Conference. The current balance is \$43,667.85

VI. OLD BUSINESS:

Vice Chairman Daugherty started discussion on the LEPC/TCEQ grant. The application process has begun and closes at the end of this month. The grant application goes through the LEPC, but since the LEPC is unable to manage a state grant, Bexar County has agreed to manage the grant. So far, requests to participate in the LEPC's grant application have been received by City of San

Antonio, San Antonio College, City of Leon Valley. LEPC is planning to request a trailer and community outreach supplies, Bexar County plans to request for hazmat equipment, COSA has a fairly extensive request to fulfill numerous projects, COLV has a couple projects they plan to request equipment for, and SAC intends to request hazmat training equipment. Currently grant application is being compiled. One complication in this grant process is the mixed messages on what can be funded by the grant, and this will get worked out.

Luiz Valdez, COLV, voiced his concerns about the grant application process. He is highly interested in submitting a request of behalf of the City of Leon Valley to be included in the LEPC's application to the TCEQ. Through correspondence with TCEQ, he has received confirmation that his request meets the intention of the grand and that TCEQ prefers this grant to support signers of mutual aid agreements. He identified that COLV is a signing party to a mutual aid agreement which should rank COLV as a higher priority in receiving funding. He was dissatisfied to see in the draft of the application that COLV was ranked below non-agreement signing departments, and that individual requests such as backup generators can be placed below more non-essential items. Additionally, he was discouraged by how LEPC has been administering this grant application.

Walt Daugherty advised that applying for this grant has been logistically difficult, and wasn't worked out until a week ago. Eligibility for homeland security funding and other stipulations have brought confusion to the process. Prioritizing of the grant projects was in order by date request was received. Additional requests may come in, and Walt will look into prioritizing scheme. Disregard any remarks made about Bexar County not submitting an application.

VII. COMMITTEE REPORTS:

- a. HazMat Watchdog Committee: (Mike Parsons, William Johnston, Patrick Lewis, Emily Thompson, Ronnie Hernandez, Johnathan Jones, Charlie Metzger)

William Johnston, BCOEM, advised on a hazmat run on July 3, 2016. There was a train derailment in the I-35 S & Fischer Road area, on a rail spur that goes to Schlumberger plant. Initial call received about incident had 60,000 gallons of sodium hydroxide released and 3 railcars involved. There was difficulty locating the train, and used DPS helicopter to find it. It was later determined only one railcar carrying sodium hydroxide leaked. Approximately 400 gallons was estimated to have leaked when a man-way gave out.

July 8, 2016 in the Gardendale area, a report of an unauthorized burn turned out to be an illegal landfill burning underneath.

August 1, 2016 Bexar county assisted Atascosa county with two 55-gallon drums dumped on the side of the road. Turned out to be used motor oil, and since it was on a TXDOT easement the TXDOT took care of it.

August 3, 2016 there was an overturned 18-wheeler on I-35 S. It was carrying hot tar and a release occurred from a ruptured man-way and a broken valve. It was 280 degrees so it needed a special pump to remediate. All contained within median.

August 9, 2016 on I-35 S and Shepherd Road exit a truck exiting the highway dropped a tote that ruptured and spilled new motor oil. Approximately 300 gallons released to median. Remediated by the Cleaning Guys, and an RP (Arnold Oil) label found.

Mike Parsons, SAFD Hazmat, mentioned that there were 13 hazmat runs since last meeting. He presented an incident map of the 13 hazmat runs. Mike discussed each incident as he highlighted them on the map.

b. Training Committee: (Walt Daugherty, Patrick Lewis, William Johnston, Stan Moczgmba)

Walt Daugherty announced that the A&M fire school is complete, and requests that the certificate of completions be sent to him. The deadline to submit information for reimbursement is August 26, 2016. Walt will then forward the information to Bexar Metro 911 so LEPC can get reimbursed.

William Johnston described his experience attending the International Hazardous Materials Conference in Baltimore in June.

Doug Meeks advised that there is a *Natural Gas Vehicle and Station Awareness Training for First Responders* being held at the GVTC Western Operations Ctr in Seguin, TX on August 17, 2016 from 7-930 pm.
