#### MINUTES FOR JULY 8, 2016

#### I. CALL MEETING TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order at approximately 10:10 a.m. by the LEPC Chairman Harold Lovejoy. Those in attendance introduced themselves.

#### II. ATTENDANCE:

#### III. CITIZENS TO BE HEARD:

#### IV. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Minutes of the June 10, 2016 meeting were distributed to attendees for review. Chairman Lovejoy asked if there were any revisions to the minutes. There were none offered. A motion was made to accept the meetings minutes as written; the motion was seconded by Mike Parsons. Motion was approved.

#### V. FINANCIAL REPORT:

John Hageman provided the information on the financial statement that he created as of June 24, 2016. A copy of the full financial report was emailed out and is attached. To summarize, there was approximately \$30 in interest income, no contributions made, no outstanding debts, and one refund just submitted by Patrick Lewis for the International Hazmat Conference in the amount of \$268.94. The current balance is \$42,430.29

#### VII. COMMITTEE REPORTS:

a. <u>HazMat Watchdog Committee:</u> (Mike Parsons, William Johnston, Patrick Lewis, Emily Thompson, Ronnie Hernandez, Johnathan Jones, Charlie Metzger)

Patrick Lewis, CESO, advised on a diesel spill on IH-35 exit at Loop 1604 from a ruptured saddle tank.

Mike Parsons, SAFD Hazmat, mentioned that there were 9 hazmat runs since last meeting. He presented an incident map of the 9 hazmat runs. Mike discussed each incident as he highlighted them on the map.

Walt Daugherty asked if someone could expand on the issue with illegal fentanyl. Shawn Varney, South Texas Poison Center, advised that fentanyl cases currently are not as common in the San Antonio area as they are on the east and west coasts. It is a very powerful opioid. Street chemists are using fentanyl instead of the more usual hydrocodone. If an unknowing drug buyer gets street painkillers and takes a dose with fentanyl instead of the intended hydrocodone, they will over dose.

b. Training Committee: (Walt Daugherty, Patrick Lewis, William Johnston, Stan Moczgmba)

Walt Daugherty announced that the A&M municipal fire school is coming up in just a couple weeks. A few slots are available.

Patrick Lewis described his experience attending the International Hazardous Materials Conference in Baltimore in June. It was well attended with good classes. Patrick offered to provide the handout information and websites he received, along with his valuable insight, to anyone interested. Michael Wagner and Willie Davis also described their conference experiences.

Steven Diaz, noted that he attended the EPA Region 6 LEPC workshop in New Braunfels on June 22, 2016. He said there are two items being addressed at EPA and the proposals are anticipated to be signed by October. Facilities with a hazardous waste storage site, are being required to add a contingency plan, exercise it, and give copies of contingency plans to LEPC. Also, RMP facilities adding release information for reportable accidents on company's public website within 30 days. Floramie Welch, SAWS, added additional information and clarification to some of EPAs proposed changes to RMP. She made special note to the proposed change for non-responding facilities to coordinate with their responding fire department. The non-responding facility shall seek a memorandum of agreement or understanding identifying that the fire department is capable of responding, to satisfy proposed RMP requirements.

#### Texas Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) Grant Program

#### **Funding**

The funds for this grant program are appropriated to the TCEQ by the Legislature and are subject to change annually. The first grant round will be approximately \$4,420,000. This grant amount is a one-time start-up grant, which includes an additional \$4,000,000 appropriated for the fiscal year 2016-2017.

Future grants will be approximately \$210,000 annually based on revenue received. Because of this, the TCEQ encourages LEPCs to use this one-time grant amount to establish large projects or plans that can be used in multiple years or shared with other LEPCs.

#### **Survey Opportunity**

Since this is a new grant program, the TCEQ is administering a survey to all of the LEPCs in an effort to receive feedback on certain elements of the grant program. The TCEQ wants to be sure it develops a program that targets the appropriate areas of need for the LEPC to help them implement the requirements of the Emergency Planning and Community Right to Know Act (EPCRA).

This survey should take about 10-15 minutes to complete and it will provided us valuable information on your LEPC's needs.

#### **EPCRA Information**

This start-up grant will allow LEPCs to establish, maintain, or improve their implementation of EPCRA. EPCRA requires each state to create a State Emergency Response Commission (SERC), designate emergency planning districts, and to establish LEPCs for each district. LEPCs are to work with facilities to develop response procedures, evacuation plans, and training programs for people who will be the first to respond in the event of an emergency. Only LEPCs that are officially recognized by the SERC are eligible for this grant.

#### History of the Grant

In the 84th Texas Legislative Session the Texas Legislature Transferred the Tier II Chemical Reporting Program to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) under Health and Safety Code 505.016 (d), 506.017(d), and 507.013(d). These chapters authorize up to 20% of chemical reporting fees to be awarded to the Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPCs) to fulfill their responsibilities under the Emergency Planning Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA).

The total amount to be awarded under this grant program will depend upon the amount of revenue received in the Tier II Chemical Reporting General Revenue Workplace Chemicals List account and the amount of money appropriated to the program from the account.
