What are the activities of the Bexar County LEPC?

- The LEPC assists with the preparation and implementation of the County's Emergency Operations Plan (EOP)
- The LEPC receives the annual Tier Two Reports (chemical inventory) from companies possessing Hazardous Materials. The information is used to perform hazard assessments for the community. LEPC must make information from these reports available to the public upon request. The LEPC may also request additional hazardous chemical information from facilities for emergency planning purposes.
- The LEPC participates in hazardous material exercises and drills to improve the response community's preparedness.
- The LEPC serves as the link between citizens, industry, and government in emergency planning and preparedness for the community. Members participate in exercises,

- training, seminars and other special projects with others in the community to build team efforts.
- The LEPC promotes emergency planning, preparedness and public awareness, to protect the community from the potential impact of natural or technological hazards of hazardous chemical and substances and related disasters.

- Participate on LEPC subcommittees.
