MINUTES FOR SEPTEMBER 8, 2017

SWRI LIBRARY - 6220 CULEBRA ROAD SAN ANTONIO, TX 78238

I. CALL MEETING TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order at approximately 10:05 a.m. by the LEPC Chairman Harold Lovejoy. Those in attendance introduced themselves.

II. ATTENDANCE:

III. CITIZENS TO BE HEARD:

IV. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Minutes of the August 11, 2017 meeting were distributed to attendees for review. A motion was made by Walt Daugherty to accept the meeting's minutes as written with minor changes; the motion was seconded by Damon Shodrock. Motion was approved.

V. FINANCIAL REPORT:

John Hageman reported on the financial statement he created using a bank statement ending August 24, 2017. A copy of the full financial report was emailed out and is attached. To summarize September's statement, there was approximately \$41 in interest/dividends income; one contribution from Flint Hills/Koch for \$3,000.00; and two checks written for almost \$317. The current balance \$52,859.92.

There is an upcoming contribution of \$1500 from HEB to the Bexar LEPC. The contribution should be received soon and included on next month's statement.

VII. OLD BUSINESS:

TCEQ LEPC Grant status - Chairman Lovejoy advised that the community outreach trailer is complete and waiting for delivery. William Johnston noted that BCOEM has received all the hazmat suits. This concludes this year's LEPC grant, and Chairman Lovejoy anticipates participating in next years TCEQ grant application process as well.

VIII. COMMITTEE REPORTS:

a. <u>HazMat Watchdog Committee:</u> (Mike Parsons, William Johnston, Patrick Lewis, Emily Thompson, Ronnie Hernandez)

William Johnston, BCOEM, advised:

- August 15, 2017 there was a report of an unknown odor along 281S near Hue Road. It
 was most likely due to cleanup at a location that had a structure fire the previous day.
- August 18, 2017 there was a white powder call downtown at the Paul Elizondo Tower.
 SAFD Hazmat also responded. A letter was sent to the District Clerk's Office that had a white substance in it. Letter was sent from a person that was incarcerated and turned out to be non-threatening but had particulates that could be explosive.
- August 21, 2017 an 18-wheeler on private property in the Bexar-Bulverde area, turned over and spilled 25-gallons of fuel out of its saddle tank. The property owner remediated spill.
- August 21, 2017 there was a fuel spill at SW Loop 410 and Somerset Road. No RP on location, and TxDOT remediated.
- August 24, 2017 a motor vehicle accident had a ruptured saddle tank release near Alamo Ranch area. RP was on site and after lots of convincing, finally remediated the site.
 - An additional substance was noticed upstream during rain event making streets slick, and Bexar County Public Works was called to assist with clean-up.

Ronnie Hernandez, SARA advised on the train derailment that occurred last month. Coal remains in one of the unnamed tributaries, and SARA is trying to work with UP to get it cleaned up. Josh Carrillo mentioned that UP is working with Calumet to get site cleaned up.

b. <u>Training Committee:</u> (Walt Daugherty, Patrick Lewis, William Johnston)

Walt Daugherty announced that he has closed out the documentation for the A&M municipal fire school, and information was taken to Bexar Metro 911 yesterday. He anticipates a check to be provided to the LEPC next week. The fire departments who had participation in the training will receive reimbursement soon.

Patrick Lewis advised that he had received a few requests for the 2017 HOTZONE Conference, but now there is a chance the conference will be cancelled. Patrick will move forward with plans while awaiting conference status.

c. Facility Operator Liaison Committee (RMP/Tier II): (Willie Davis, William Johnston, Steve Diaz)

Chairman Lovejoy noted that he received the disk with 2016 Tier 2 info on it, and see him if you are interested in the information.




