

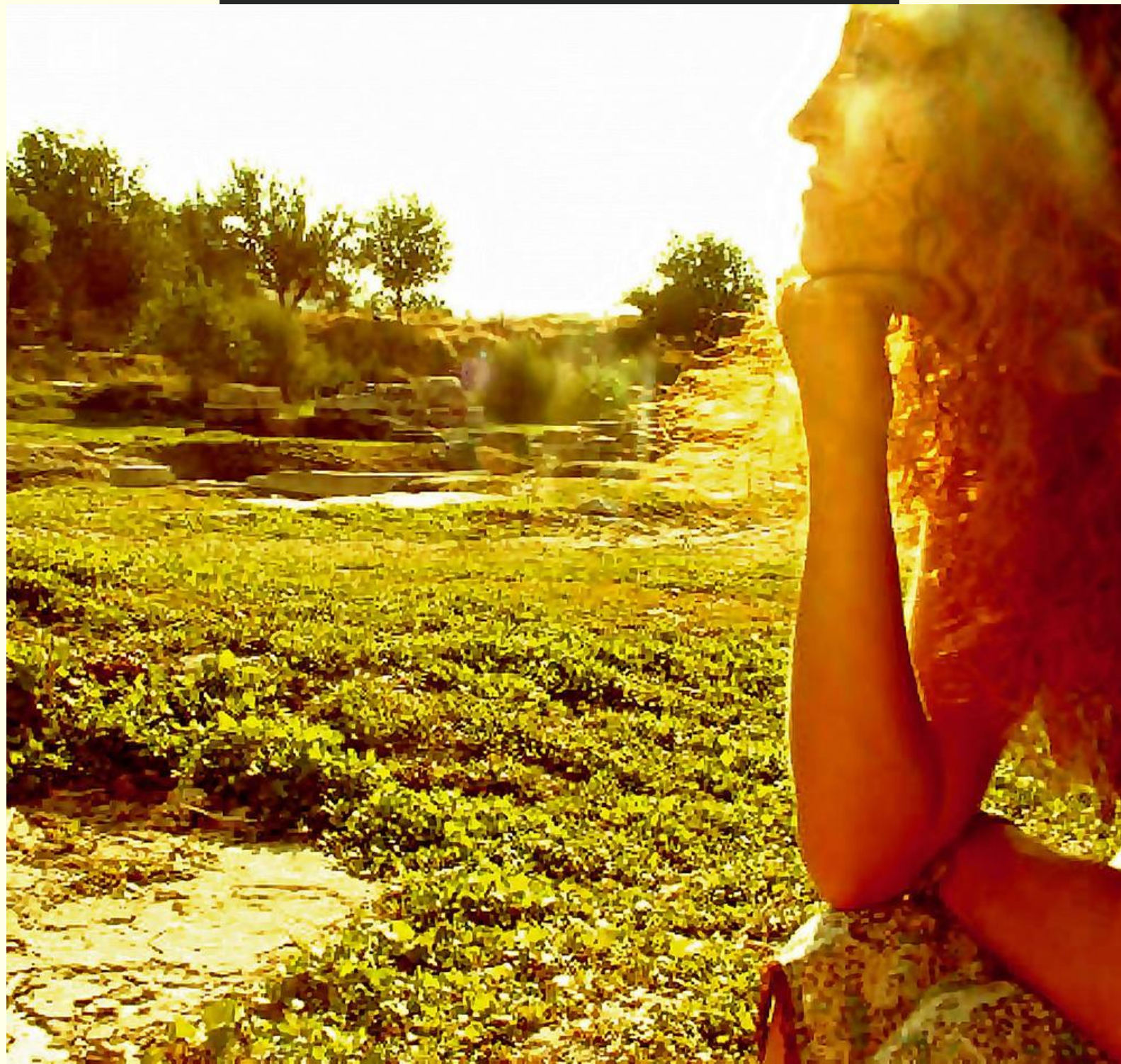

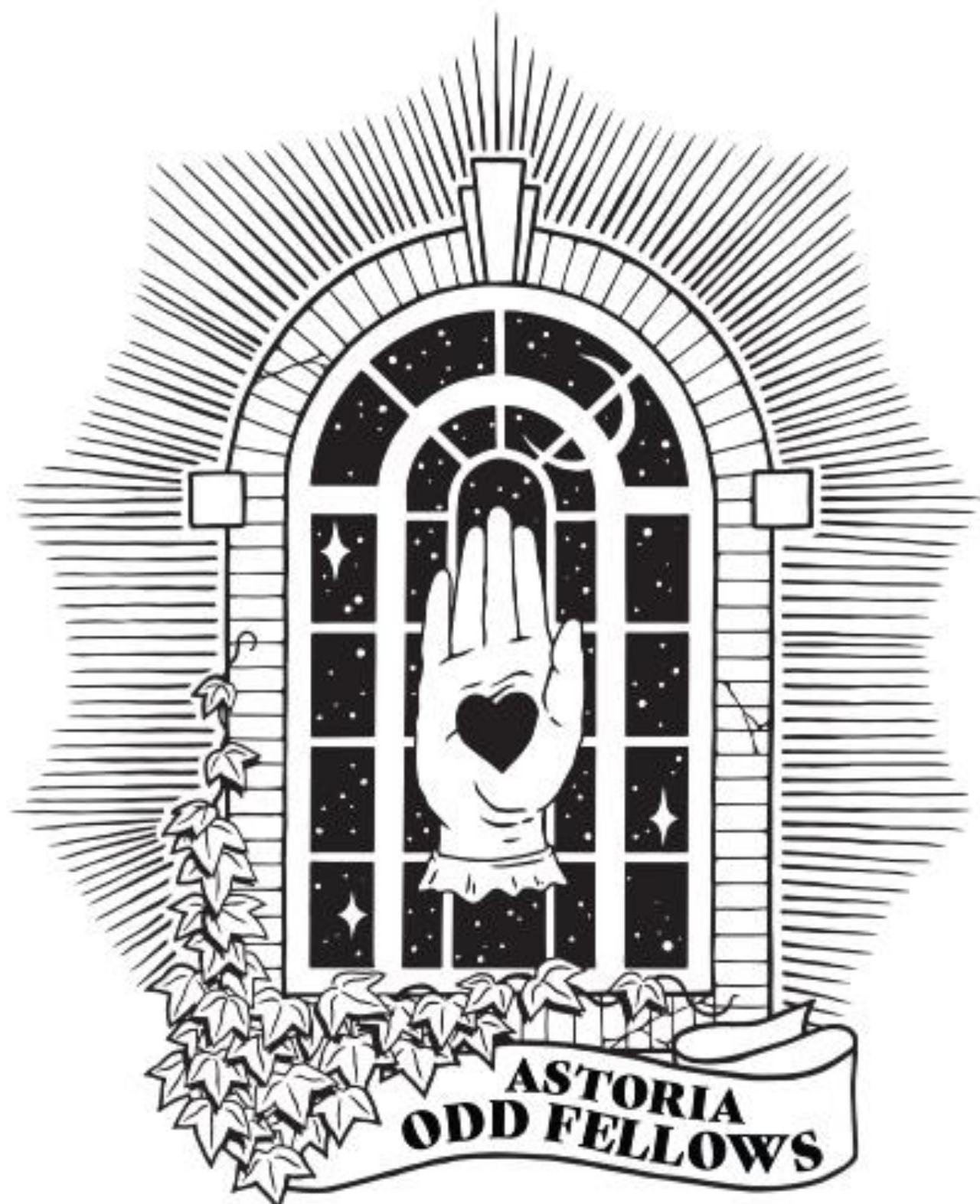

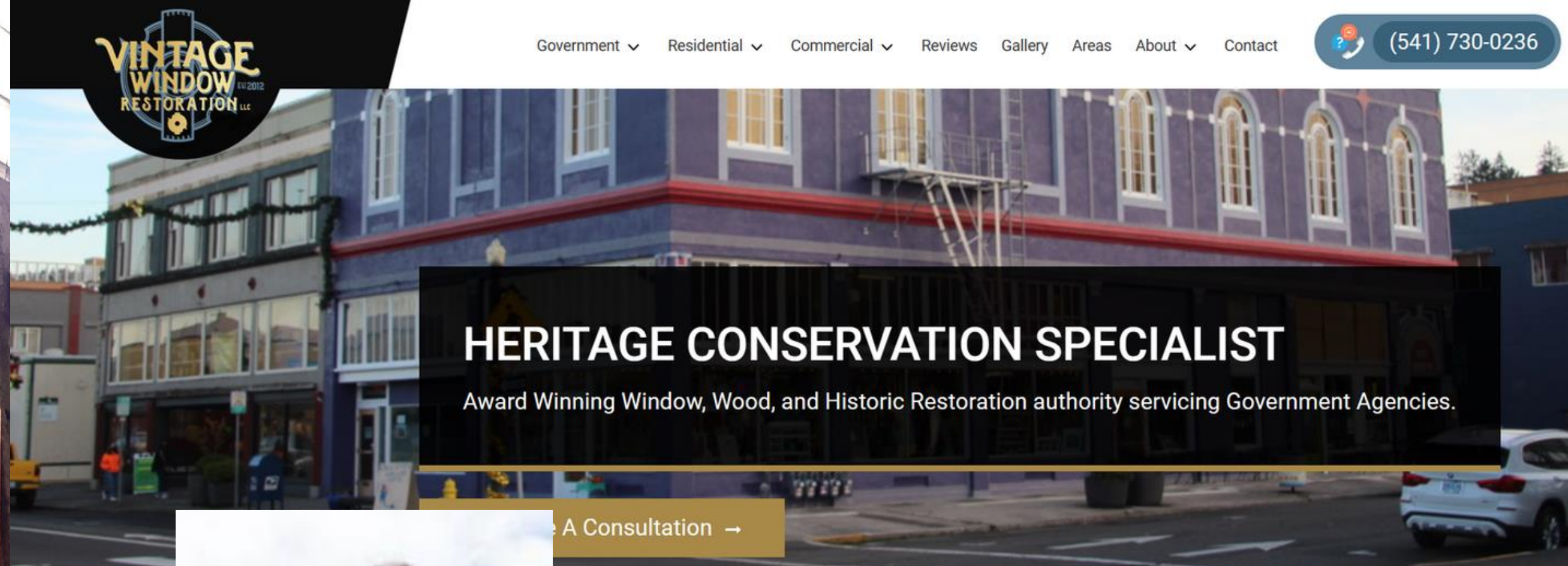

Located in the port city of Astoria, the oldest American settlement west of the Rockies, the Odd Fellows Building was the first structure rebuilt after a devastating fire in 1923.

Today, three women own the Odd Fellows Building, which has served the local community for over 90 years. Astoria Arts and Movement, the heart of the building, is a flourishing center for local dance, performing arts, and physical education classes that enhance, inspire, and engage the community.

Tenants in the building are all women-owned businesses, including an art studio, apothecary, gallery, and a coffee shop.

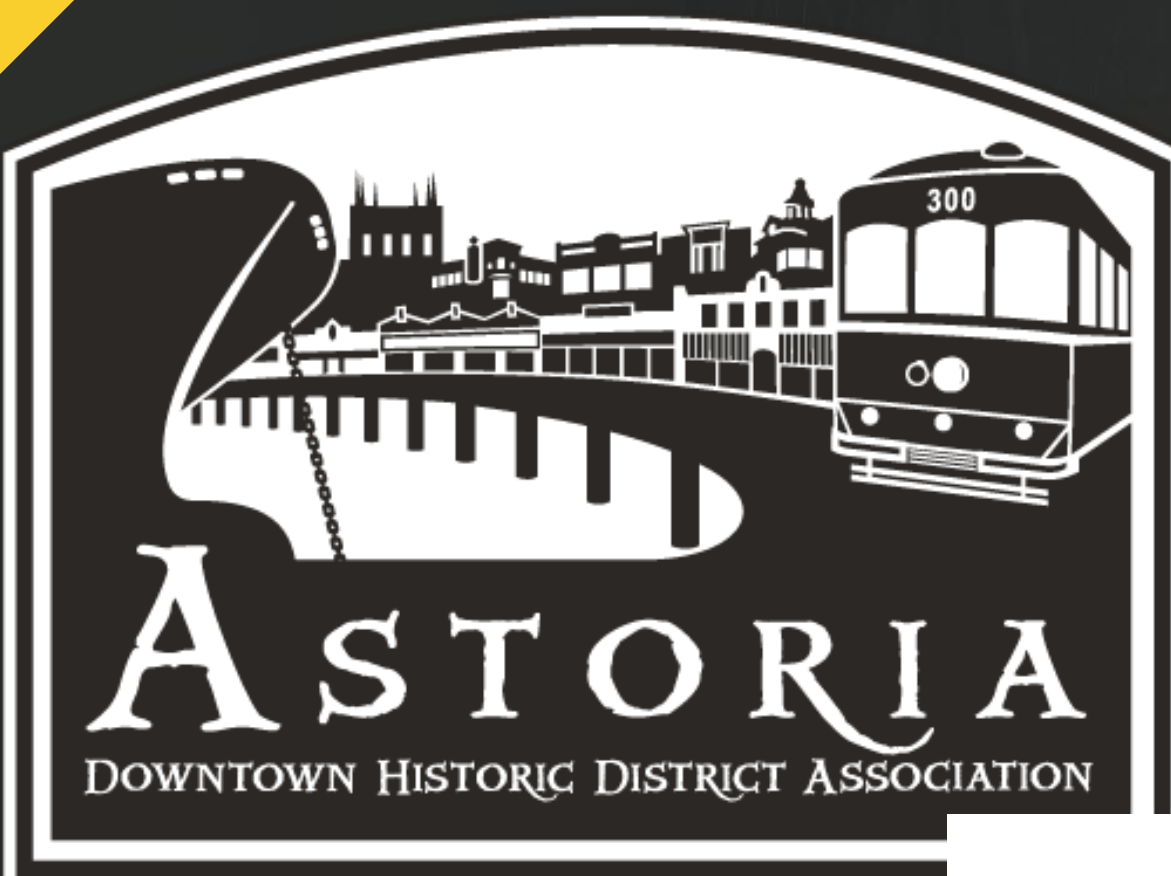

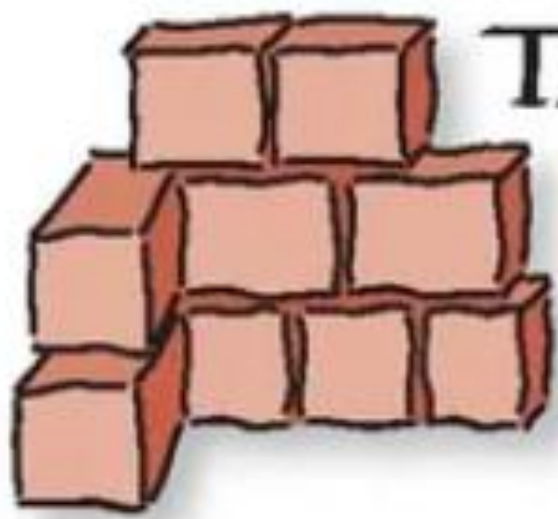
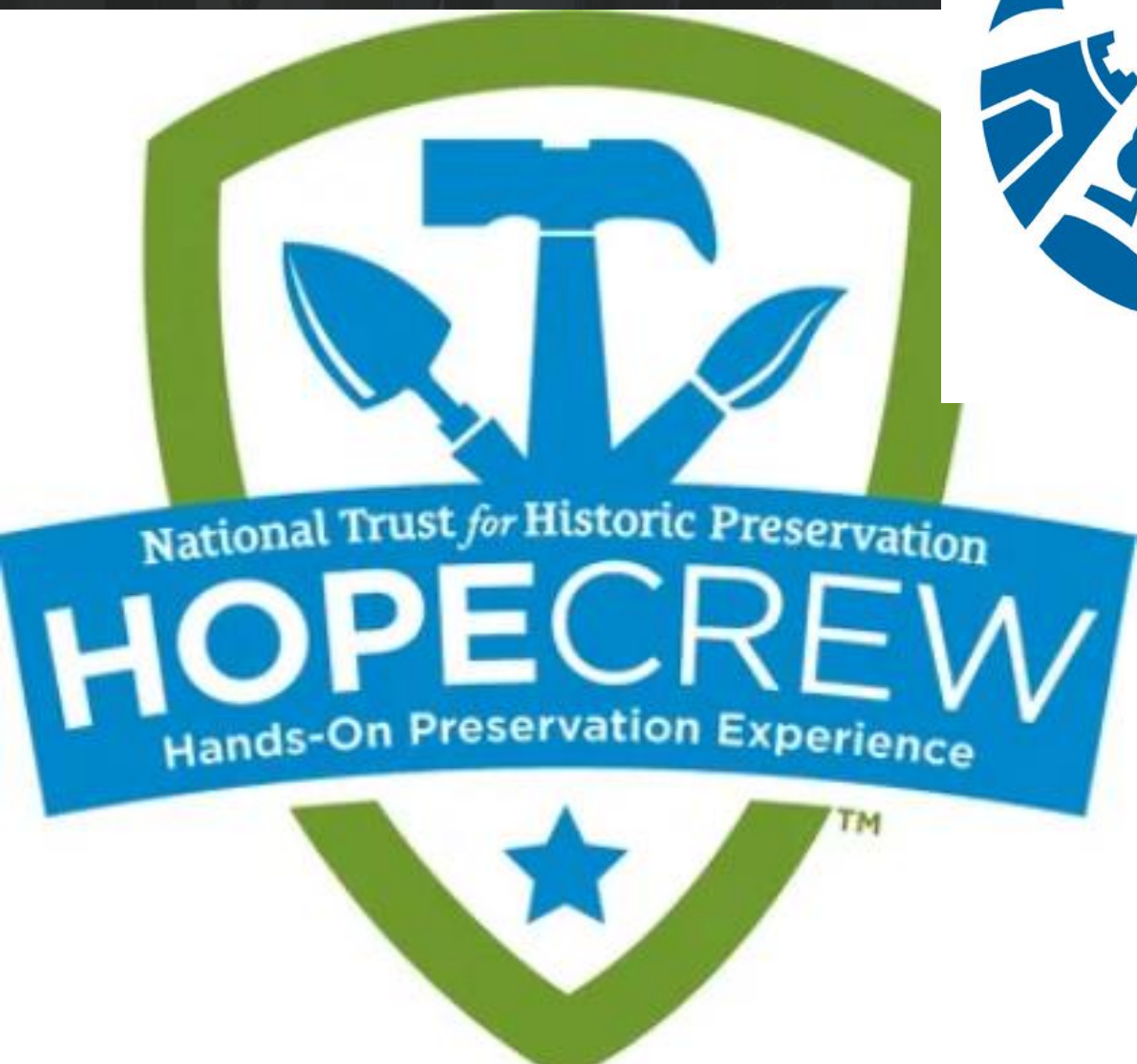

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE A MAIN STREET ORGANIZATION?

Main Street America is a powerful network of downtown commercial districts as part of the national movement of the National Main Street Center, a subsidiary of the National Trust for Historic Preservation, and is the leading voice for preservation-based economic development and community revitalization across the country. The Main Street movement grew out of a recognition that a community is only as strong as its core.



WEST.

On one red morn in December, 1922, Astoria burned. The story of that disaster is old. The story of the New Astoria is new. Where 11 hours of hellfire served to sink the entire business section of the city into a 40-acre desert with even the streets destroyed, it has taken months to create the new city—but the new city is very fair to look upon. Not only is it good to see, but there is a stirring tingle in one's blood when he reads in stone walls which have risen from stark cinders the tale of a people's indomitable will, deathless faith and unflinching courage.
