
Dave Scott's first R/C School by Mike McTague

We are very fortunate to have Carl as our instructor. His calm demeanor and knowledge are great assets to our club.

If you are seeking a more condensed, immersive experience, I recommend Dave Scott's 1st RC flight school. A couple weeks ago I was able to attend a training class; I have attended for a few years now and have really enjoyed this experience. I seem to get so busy that my practice time is limited and devoting myself to this condensed time is really useful to me. Dave offers a concentrated 5 day primary solo course and a 4 day acrobatic course. I have taken the acrobatic course the last few years. I believe the course is well worth the 769.00 price tag. I am fortunate to have family I can stay with in Appleton, otherwise a hotel room in Shawano, WI would also be needed. Being a science teacher myself, I really appreciate Dave's skill as an instructor. He takes you at your own level and gives you a great basis to grow your skills. His flight manuals are very well written and understandable. He is a regular contributor to AMA magazine. Typically, class size is no more than 3, which gives you plenty of stick time, and observing Dave work with your fellow students also enhances your learning. Another aspect of this experience is learning to fly in conditions (wind) that might have caused you to stay away from the field. Check out 1st rc flight school at www.rcflightschool.com
