MEETING MINUTES by Craig Brown

September 15, 2025 Meeting

President's Report - Bruce Volocyk

The following items were noted by Bruce:

- **Picnic** Another successful picnic was held on Sunday, August 14. Thanks to Steve Gelman, Gene Derbick, and all of the other individuals that assisted with making such a great event.
- Sheriff Department Visits Bruce noted that Sheriff's department personnel have recently visited the
 Deer Grove flying field on several occasions. This is a normal occurrence and should not be alarming
 to members. RC Pilots should always have their AMA membership card and FAA registration available
 to present to the officers. Bruce also noted that AMA and FAA flying regulations must be followed by
 club members at all times.
- FRIA Area Bruce addressed where the FRIA area is designated at our flying field:
 - A FRIA (<u>FAA-Recognized Identification Area</u>) is a designated geographic area, established by the FAA, where drones and radio-controlled aircraft can be flown without Remote ID equipment, provided the drone and pilot remain within the FRIA boundaries and the pilot maintains visual line of sight.
 - The FRIA should not be confused with a field boundary. The FRIA is only for designating an area where the Remote ID is not required. It is not a formal boundary for the flying field itself.
 - The paved back path on the back side of the flying field should be respected as much as possible when path users are present.
- **Fall Elections** Elections for the Blue Max board will be held in November. Please reach out to the current officers if you are interested in running for a position or being on the board.
- Plane Donation The estate of a former RC enthusiast reached out to Jim Ackleson (former Blue Max president) with an offer to donate ~75 mostly new RC planes. The planes are currently being stored at Jim's house and will be auctioned off in the near future, with proceeds to benefit the club.

One correction was noted for the August 18, 2025 minutes. The previous minutes erroneously stated that electronic payments could be made to the club using "Venmo". 
