## By the King,

## A Royal Proclamation

(to declare the De'Jure Kingdom of England 927-1707 in a State of Emergency)

Hear Ye Hear Ye,

King Clifford Jefferson (Geoffrey), ascendant and descendant from The House of Plantagenet, Heirs of John I, son of Henry II, son of Geoffrey V, Count of Anjou. (Time Immemorial - Richard I 1189 A.D.)

To all Local Governments, such as Villages, Borough, Townships, Municipalities, Counties, including but not limited to their Agencies, Departments, Offices, including but not limited to their Officers, Agents and Assignees. The English Church of England, now known as The Third Temple English Church of England, through its members as officers, have lawfully convened in quorum, January 14, 2020, deriving their authority from the Great Charter or Magna Carta, pursuant to the N.J.R.S. 16:1-28.

Our Religious Society and it members are inhabitants of the Province of New Jersey, the territory of Bailiwick of Jersey, under the English government, in which there was no such religious freedom as the English Church of England was the state church. Our Government, The New Jersey Provincial Council was the upper house of the New Jersey Legislature under colonial rule until it was replaced by the New Jersey Legislative Council under the New Jersey Constitution of 1776.

The instructions from Queen Anne to Viscount Cornbury, the first royal governor of New Jersey, outlined a fusion of powers system, which allowed for an overlap of executive, legislative and judicial authority. It provided for a bicameral legislature consisting of a Council and General Assembly. At the onset of the American Revolution, New Jersey was governed by waning British colonial authority. William Franklin, the province's last royal governor before the American Revolution (1775-83), was marginalized in the last year of his tenure, as the province was run de facto by the Provincial Congress of New Jersey. Franklin considered the Provincial Congress to be an "illegal assembly" and attempted to reassert royal authority, now restored 1/12/2020 A.D./ 2970, meeting convened in quorum. In June 1776, the Provincial Congress formally deposed Franklin and had him arrested, adopted its first state constitution on July 2, 1776, and reorganized the province into an independent state. The newly formed State of New Jersey elected William Livingston as its first governor on August 31, 1776-a position he would be reelected to until his death in 1790.
