We at the Friends of the Poway Library are committed to supporting the Poway Community Library to the best of our abilities. Our Board of Directors and other volunteers work diligently to raise funds to meet the wide variety of financial needs of the library. Our goal is to support the library staff in making Poway Library responsive to the needs and wants of our Friends members and the community at large.

Sometimes, however, opinions may differ as to what form that support should take. We are a member organization, so the obvious thing to do is to ask our members – that’s *you* – to find out if we are going in the right direction and if we are not, which way do you wish we would go?

Some may say that physical books are a thing of the past. Do you agree? In our current fiscal year we donated \$10,000 to the County’s Matching Funds program to purchase both physical and digital books, magazine and newspaper subscriptions, and other materials. Do you want us to continue to do this? Should we plan to donate even more for the next fiscal year?

Currently at Poway Library we have a wide range of programs for children of all ages, for adults, and for families. Many, if not most, of these programs are paid for by the Friends of the Poway Library. Do you, our members, take

advantage of these programs? Do you wish we had even more of them? If so, which ones do you like the best? Where should we try to expand? Is there anything we are doing that you wish we would stop?

We discussed – *briefly* – the possibility of doing a telephone survey, but we don’t like people bothering us with phone calls and we figured you probably don’t enjoy them either. So we’re going to leave it up to you. We don’t have a long list of questions for you to answer or issues to rate on a scale of 1 to 100. We realize that some of you joined the Friends primarily to get discounts on books in our Friends Book Store and early admittance to our giant book sales. Maybe you don’t really use the library all that much. That’s fine; we’re happy to have you as members for whatever reason. As you know, the popular, long-time manager of the Friends of the Poway Library Book Store, John Williams, retired last October. It is taking a team of *three* volunteers to fill his shoes.

Sharron Watson began volunteering for the Friends back in 2003. We were preparing for the fifth anniversary of the Poway Library in its current location. We persuaded Sharron to use her considerable creative talents to put together several attractive gift baskets that were used as prizes at the anniversary celebration. We haven't let her go since then. Sharron has served on the Friends Board of Directors continuously since 2005, including as President from 2005 to 2007 and again from 2022 to the present.

Sharron especially loves children's books and has been in charge of the Children's area of the Friends Book Store for many years. She, along with Christina Niemeyer, keep that area stocked with clean, attractive books for kids of all ages. They also put together the outstanding book presentations on the display tables in front of the windows.

Retired Silicone Valley software engineer Susan Casey Davis started volunteering when the Poway Library opened in its current location in 1998. She served as President of the Friends from 2001 to 2005 and was named San Diego County Library's Volunteer of the Year in 2006.

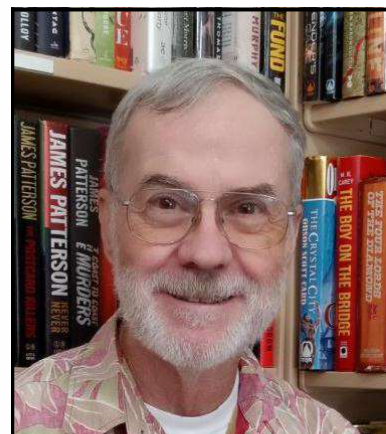
In 2008, she took a break to pursue other volunteer opportunities, but she returned to the Friends Board in 2021 when we reopened after the Covid lockdown.
