Harry performs magic . . . and he can fly, too! (no, not Harry Potter – Friends Volunteer Harry Abbott)

Frequent visitors to our Friends of the Poway Library Book Store have no doubt become familiar with many of our wonderful volunteers, however they, or rather, *you*, may not have met one of our longest-serving volunteers, Harry Abbott. Although Harry can sometimes be found in the Book Store shelving books or in the parking lot helping donors with their book donations, Harry most often works in the "Back Room" or staff area, processing newlyarrived donations. Other than Book Store Manager John Williams, Harry Abbott is arguably the volunteer who is most critical to the success of our operation. More on that later.

Harry began volunteering for the Poway Library back in the 1990s when the Library was located in a storefront of the Lively Center. At that time, Harry tutored library patrons on the use of this new-fangled thing called the internet.



Through the years, Harry continued helping out with our giant book sales, but took some time out – about five years, in fact – from volunteering to build his own experimental airplane, a "Long-EZ." The Long-EZ has a canard layout (a canard is a fuselage-mounted horizontal surface which is located in front of the main wing to provide stability and control, but you already knew that, right?), a swept wing with wingtip rudders, and a pusher engine and propeller. Below on the left is a photo of Harry's plane on his driveway, mid-build. The photo on the right is of Harry's finished plane in flight, with Harry at the controls.

Back down on earth and back to the Back Room where Harry performs some real magic: he conjures order out of chaos. Harry is responsible for keeping us from being suffocated under an avalanche of books, magazines, DVDs, CDs, jigsaw puzzles and a variety of other items that come to us from our generous donors. For the most part, it is Harry who performs the initial sorting: separating fiction from non-fiction, paperbacks from trade editions and hard cover books; new magazines which will be offered for sale in the Book Store from older ones that will go on the "free" cart; and so on. Donations arrive at the Library in a variety of sizes of boxes, paper grocery bags, tote bags, plastic shopping bags or just in stacks. All donations have to be packed into standard-size library boxes so that they can be stored safely and efficiently. Harry handles an estimated 80 - 90% of this initial sorting and packing. Amazingly, while sorting, Harry also is able to ferret out items that may have a monetary value that make them worth listing for sale online *and* he looks for books that are on our Book Request list. Oh yes, Harry also maintains the computerized Book Request list. . . . in his spare time.

If there is anyone who knows our DVD and CD inventory, it's Harry. In addition to keeping the DVD and CD shelves in the Book Store stocked, Harry and volunteer Bob Masters hold special Media Sales in the Library Courtyard several times each year. Our guests get fantastic deals on media and Harry and Bob raise muchneeded funds for the Library.

There is an old saying the no one is indispensable. Is Harry Abbott indispensable to the smooth operations of the Friends Book Store? We don't want to find out!

"New" Poway Library is Nearly 25 Years Old

It was nearly 25 years ago that our current Poway Community Library building was dedicated. Volunteer extraordinaire Joye Davisson has served continuously on the Friends of the Poway Library Board of Directors, several times as President, since those days. We asked her to reminisce and share with us her memories of that time.

As we look forward to celebrating 25 years in our current Poway Community Library and acknowledge 110 years of library service in our community, I am reminded of my history with the Poway Library.

I first became involved with the Friends of the Poway Library back in the early 90s when the Friends sent letters to the local non-profits asking for support in the form of a resolution citing the need for a new library. At that time they invited the groups to send a representative to their meetings. So I volunteered and that began my journey as a strong supporter of our Poway Library.

From our small facility in the Lively Center to our current location, I've been there. I was privileged to represent the Friends when we went to City Council to ask Poway to fund Sunday hours. I was fortunate to serve on the Library Advisory Committee. When the Long's Drug store location fell through, we received a donation that established the Library Endowment Fund. Then the search for a location was back on and the Friends lobbied for the current location citing that a central location made sense.


The site was chosen and the real work began. At the same time, the Sheriff's Department was in need of a larger facility and the decision was made to locate their Poway headquarters and the library on the same site.

Finally with many meetings and even more decisions to be made, the construction was underway. What a thrill to watch our new library under construction. We were finally going to have a building that would suit our community needs.

The path to our library was not always smooth, but our current facility was dedicated in 1998, upgraded in 2015 and we have a library that suits our community. Through all these years our community has been blessed with wonderful staff members who pride themselves on the opportunity to work in the Poway Library.

Libraries are not the quiet libraries of many years ago, they are vibrant and the heart of the community, providing not only books, but DVDs, CDs, audio books, exciting programs and much more.


