Tune It Out

Author: Jamie Sumner

In Tune It Out by Jamie Sumner, we follow the story of Louise. Our main character is 12 years old and has a sensory processing disorder, making the vocal performances her mother insists she undertake to keep them afloat beyond stressful. There is no sense of normalcy in this life. Soon after a car accident, Lou is whisked away by Child Protective Services and sent to live with her aunt all the way across the country in Nashville. The timing couldn't be worse, Lou had just been seen by a talent scout and she and her mother were THIS close to finally making it, moving out of their truck, and having a place of their own. Sumner gracefully weaves in heart and the descriptions of the episodes that Lou experiences when strangers touch and crowd her are quite vivid and realistic. There is a sense of honesty to this book, and relevance, as Lou navigates a complex situation. Whether this story is one that reminds you of your own life or gives you a glimpse into another world, readers ten and up will enjoy the journey.

The High Five Habit

Author: Mel Robbins

Most self help books stay on the shelf. Or you read maybe a chapter and quit (they all seem to say the same thing or make you feel like you are broken). Or you don't open them at all.

How many do you have that are seriously disappointing?

Get ready for an epiphany. This book kept just might keep you up at night reading -- like a great novel.

Mel's "voice" was like having a friend talk to me. From the start, I was wearing the author's shoes (she has been through some STUFF), and she SHOWED me what worked for her and what could work for me. It's not just a pep talk or the usual "affirmations work" and "positive thinking is key."

This digs deeper into becoming more invested and accepting of yourself and your flaws in all their glory. The exercises (your self-esteem is like a muscle) are backed by solid science. Brass tacks - this book is the difference between self-acceptance (achievable, with this work) and self-embracing (feels too big and too much and too self-absorbed). Add that Mel has an online group you can join with others on this adventure, and you have a winner. I have had people tell me they notice a difference in me - and I feel it too.

Start high fiving the most crucial person in your life: the one in the mirror.

If you struggle with self-doubt (and who doesn't?) ...

If you're tired of that nagging critic in your head (time to tell them to shut up and have it work!) ...

If you're successful, yet you only focus on is what's going wrong (you're not the only one) ...

If you're sick of watching everybody else get ahead while you seem to be on pause...

This book is for you.

More New Faces





I look forward to the time I get to spend here at Poway."




