Congratulations to Karen Baluyot who was recently promoted to a position at headquarters. Karen was a "go to" person and she will be missed. We wish her all the best.



## ***Other Boys***

Author: Damian Alexander

Aimed at young people 10-14 years old, *Other Boys* is a story of being shunned by the world. It is a must-read autobiographical juvenile graphic novel, an amazing debut both written and drawn by Damian Alexander. The artwork is clean with a peppy use of color. Our narrator wants nothing more than to blend into the shadows after the death of his mother and incessant bullying by children at his school. Damian and his brother are taken in by their grandparents. He has a chance to be a brand new 7th-grader at a shiny new school. To avoid any issues with the other kids, he decides to no longer speak at school. But, alas! His well-meaning grandmother has told his teachers of his mother's death, and they in turn told the students. Now everyone knows he has no mother.



Will his plan of staying silent backfire? How will he ever make it through school?

Damian fantasizes about having the same types of things as the other children, things like a washing machine or two cars, but mostly a mother. With his father not in the picture, either, things seem bleak. He is teased for being poor, and worse, he enjoys things that other boys do not, like playing with dolls and sewing with his grandmother. Alexander handles the sharp sadness in a touching and lovely way that shows a deep empathy for the young reader. This is a fantastic book, especially for anyone that has experienced bullying, loss of a loved one, homophobia, domestic violence, or poverty. The graphic novel does not shy away from the subject matter at hand. This is a memoir. These things happened. The effects are real. In Damian Alexander and his delightfully brave work, a new and stunning talent has been discovered.
