WORSHIP GUIDE

PRELUDE - Listen and sing along to a song or hymn that blesses and centers your spirit!

OPENING PRAYER -

Whenever we approach unfamiliar territories, we often forget that You are at work. When we sense the pressing need to act now, we often forget that You are in control. Whenever we feel contraction in our bodies and shortness in our breath, You open us up and breathe Life into us.

Dear God, we live in a world that demands so much of us - a world that requires us to always be on the go, to move, to produce, to excel, to do something, to react...

This constant motion prevents us from seeing the new things that You have for us.

Our constant moving, producing, excelling, doing, and reacting wears us out. Yet we have become ever more delighted by the work, than the Life that it brings us.

May You make room in our hearts, minds, and beings, that we may remain open to the new things that you have for us – the coming of the Holy Spirit, and her works!

May we always remember ...

That You are at work...

That You are in control...

That You open us up and breathe Life into us...

Day after day after day...

In the mighty name of the One who's returning, Jesus Christ, Amen.

SCRIPTURE READING - Acts 2:1-21, NRSV

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. ² And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³ Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

⁵ Now there were devout Jews from every people under heaven living in Jerusalem. ⁶ And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. ⁷ Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸ And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? ⁹ Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰ Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, ¹¹ Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." ¹² All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" ¹³ But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."

¹⁴ But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Fellow Jew and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. ¹⁵ Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. ¹⁶ No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

¹⁷ 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams.

- ¹⁸ Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy.
- ¹⁹ And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist.
- ²⁰ The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood,

before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day.

²¹ Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'
