WORSHIP GUIDE

What is our call today? To worship an awesome God who sends forth healing to a hurting world.

Let us worship God this day as new life comes forth in the name of Jesus Christ!

OPENING PRAYER -

Lord of mystery and community, you have called us here this day to remind us of the mission journey you set before us. Help us to pay attention to the words of Jesus as he sent out his disciples on a mission of healing and compassion. Remind us that success is not measured in the cures, but in the striving. Enable us to truly be your disciples in this world.

Move us out of our comfort zones, O God, out of our reticence, out of all that keeps us from responding to Jesus' sending. Bless us with your holy boldness and your extravagant love for the world. On this UMCOR Sunday, illuminate hope in the midst of disaster, illuminate love in the midst of fear, illuminate peace in the midst of violence. Amen.

SCRIPTURE - Mark 6:1-13 / The Message

¹⁻² He left there and returned to his hometown. His disciples came along. On the Sabbath, he gave a lecture in the meeting place. He stole the show, impressing everyone. "We had no idea he was this good!" they said. "How did he get so wise all of a sudden, get such ability?" ³ But in the next breath they were cutting him down: "He's just a carpenter—Mary's boy. We've known him since he was a kid. We know his brothers, James, Justus, Jude, and Simon, and his sisters. Who does he think he is?" They tripped over what little they knew about him and fell, sprawling. And they never got any further. ⁴⁻⁶ Jesus told them, "A prophet has little honor in his hometown, among his relatives, on the streets he played in as a child." Jesus wasn't able to do much of anything there—he laid hands on a few sick people and healed them, that's all. He couldn't get over their stubbornness. He left and made a circuit of the other villages, teaching.

⁷⁻⁸ Jesus called the Twelve to him, and sent them out in pairs. He gave them authority and power to deal with the evil opposition. He sent them off with these instructions: ⁸⁻⁹ "Don't think you need a lot of extra equipment for this. *You* are the equipment. No special appeals for funds. Keep it simple. ¹⁰ "And no luxury inns. Get a modest place and be content there until you leave. ¹¹ "If you're not welcomed, not listened to, quietly withdraw. Don't make a scene. Shrug your shoulders and be on your way." ¹²⁻¹³ Then they were on the road. They preached with joyful urgency that life can be radically different; right and left they sent the demons packing; they brought wellness to the sick, anointing their bodies, healing their spirits.

This is the Word of God for the People of God. Thanks be to God!
