July 4th Parade Is Back In-Person

At last, we can welcome the neighborhood to our very special annual July 4th Parade again! And we are delighted and honored that Ernie Merlán, neighbor and founder of Muralism, has agreed to be our Grand Marshal to mark this Independence Day celebration.

As you always have, we know that you will help us ensure the Parade's success by joining in on foot or on bike, tricycle, wheelchair or pony! So go that extra step and decorate your bikes, skateboard, golf carts pick-ups and cars ... and yourselves ... in everything red, white and blue! We are hoping for a lot of photos this year, too, so please take photos and send them to mail@Valleyvillagera.com.

Please Note: Safety rules require no standing in a moving vehicle and no sitting or standing on the back of pick-up trucks or flatbeds.

The parade begins at 10 a.m. at the corner of Addison Street and Morella Avenue. However you arrive – on foot, bike, skateboard, or wheelchair, please enter from Colfax Avenue and line up on Addison Street. Cars, trucks and golf carts line up on Morella Avenue and must enter from Huston Street.

The Parade, led by the marching band from North Hollywood High School, heads west on Addison Street, turns right on Ben Avenue (north), right on Otsego Street (east), crosses Colfax Avenue to Irvine Avenue where it turns right (south) and left on Hesby Street (east). The route then crosses Westpark Drive and enters Valley Village Park.

This is the highlight of our Valley Village Residents Association year, so come on out and cheer on the marchers, or join us at Valley Village Park where the parade ends, and the party begins. Enjoy watermelon donated by Jon's Market, donuts from Yum Yum, corn dogs from Wienerschnitzel and bottled water from Gelson's. Get together with your neighbors and enjoy the music.

And <u>don't forget to stop by the VVRA table and meet members of the Board.</u> We will be happy to talk with you and get to know you better. Bring your membership dues and enter the drawing for a door prize!

<u>Rob's Beat</u>

Hello Valley Villagers,

Summer is here and I hope all of you are well. We usually experience an increase in crime in the summer, but Valley Village continues to be lower year-to-date than last year. Our goal is to keep it that way.

Year-to-date in Valley Village, there is a 6% reduction in total crime. Although we were at a negative 8% reduction a couple of months ago, 6% reduction is still a good number. Almost every Basic car area in North Hollywood is experiencing double digit crime increases, specifically in the areas of aggravated assault, burglary and grand theft auto. But Valley Village has no increase in aggravated assaults, an over 12% decrease in burglary, 12% decrease in burglary from a vehicle and a 43% decrease in robbery. The only crime category that is up in Valley Village is grand theft auto, up 17%.

If you can garage your vehicle, please do so. If you have to park your car on the street or tandem park in a parking lot or structure, please take all of your KEYS AND FOBs OUT OF THE CAR – that way you can really reduce your chances of becoming a victim of a crime. The number of vehicles being stolen with the keys inside is staggering.

4th of July is coming up and though I'm sorry to say I will be out of town and miss this one, North Hollywood Officers and Cadets are looking forward to joining your July 4th Parade and celebrating with you.

At its meeting on April 11, the Board noted ~The speaker for the General Membership meeting this month will be Whitney Wade, a professional food-to-table gardener and teacher ~The RV causing complaints for overstaying its welcome at VV Park has been removed, and the westbound on-ramp at Laurel Canyon has been cleaned up. ~Efforts will be made to encourage membership in the 91601 area; a letter to realtors indicating the Association's existence, mission and accomplishments will also be sent out. ~Arrangements will need to be made given the new venue for VVRA membership meetings at 5000 Colfax Avenue. ~The new VVRA sign is due to be installed just north of the 101 freeway, and a street sign "pole painting" is scheduled for May 14. ~VVRA is keeping its finger on the pulse of activities involving Burbank Airport flight patterns and the FAA.

Parade Grand Marshal - Ernie Merlán

With a passion for art and helping others Ernie and his family have helped to make Valley Village a more beautiful place for over 20 years. You might remember the "Halloween House" on Radford and Hartsook, where as many as 2000 neighbors would gather to dance to Thriller and the Monster Mash. For 8 years he ran the build for the Colfax Fair. He was responsible for creating sculpted decoration on the Fourth of July Parade golf carts for several years running. He is currently serving on the Neighborhood Council of Valley Village City Services committee.

Professionally, Ernie is the Executive Director of <u>Muralism.org</u>, a nonprofit dedicated to connecting people with special needs to the community through art. They hire young adults with special needs as artists to design murals, as well as wash, prep and transfer art

onto walls for murals throughout the community. Volunteers are invited to come in to transform in the paint by number images into art. Muralism (with funds from to NCVV) has painted over 30 electrical boxes in Valley Village alone.

Mr. Merlán was previously the Executive Director of a one of a kind visual



effects and animation program for young adults with Autism, Exceptional Minds. He has worked 30+ years in the entertainment industry with Disney Imagineering (Disneyland, Disney World, Tokyo Disney Seas) and Universal Studios Creative (Hollywood, Florida and Port Aventura, Spain), as well as in feature film production (Mask of Zorro, Legend of Zorro, Dance with Me). He later migrated towards digital animation and visual design, as the CEO of Merlán Creative, designing graphics, fly-through sets, murals and augmented reality for high-end clients (Partial list includes: The Walt Disney Company, Universal Studios, Morley Builders, and Regis and Kelly).

Ernie says: "Receiving this honor from my own community and for the parade I love so much is truly a thrill. I look forward to seeing you all at the parade and I hope that you all come paint with me soon!"




