

#### JOIN US IN THE PLENTIFUL GIFTS PROGRAM!

We are joining six other churches in the Utica Presbytery for the **Plentiful Gifts Program**, initiated by the Dubuque Theological Seminary and funded by a Lilly Foundation grant. This program helps churches discover and strengthen the gifts of their people—not money or possessions, but the people themselves—to carry out the ministries God has called us to do. **Plentiful Gifts** supports churches facing changing times

Plentiful Gifts supports churches facing changing times—smaller congregations, less funding, and part-time or no pastors—by helping them clarify their identity, discover leadership, and equip those leaders through local training. Over the next 18 months, the program will offer training, mentorship, fully funded retreats, and resources tailored to our church's needs. Our mentor, Michelle Dolan, and Presbytery Catalyst Rev. Sam Pendergrast will guide us through this process. Rick Kincaid, Rebecca Willsey, and John Faust have already begun working with consultants from Dubuque Seminary to lay the foundation.

# FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR...

April is a month filled with a wide range of experiences. Spring has begun, the crocus and lilies are sprouting through the ground with the promise of warmer weather, flowers, and green landscaping. But in the blink of an eye, the temperature gets cold, and surprise snowstorms can result in deep breaths of frustration, with the words, "When will it end?" This is especially true this year. In April, we've been reminded in the Sermon Series on the Days of Holy Week, the path is filled with much hurt and disappointment. The religious leaders use treachery to arrest Jesus and set him up for execution. Jesus is betrayed by one of his own, most likely out of greed. False accusations by the religious leaders led Jesus before Pilate. Pilate abdicates leadership and lets the religious leaders force him to sentence Jesus to death. Peter and the Disciples deny even knowing Jesus. Jesus is beaten, whipped, and ultimately suffers one of the most painful means of execution known to humanity, crucifixion. The Disciples are now in fear for their own lives and wonder why they left their jobs and family to follow Jesus.

#### But that is not the end of the Story.

Easter, on April 20<sup>th,</sup> is the celebration of Christ's resurrection. It means sin and death are conquered and all who believe in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus have new life here on earth in in the New Heaven and New Earth to come. This can sound like fantasy, idealistic and fanciful, but what about everyday life? The reality impacts everyday living. We know we are not alone with everyday struggles. We know we have power over temptation. We know we have direct access to God in prayer. We know we have greater potential for purposes greater than our own capabilities.

I truly hope you will join us this Easter Sunday, April 20<sup>th,</sup> for an Easter Breakfast at 8:30am provided by Tom and Claudia Wattles, and our Easter Celebration is going to follow at 10:00am Bring your family and friends. Invite your neighbors. Come as you are!
