

Recent Rainstorms & the Fruits of the Spirit

This has been a particularly dry spring in Central New York. When my wife and I left at the beginning of June for a couple of weeks of weeks of vacation in Canada our lawn was beginning to turn brown and climatologists were predicting that the hot, dry weather was rapidly leading to drought conditions. With the rain, plants and bulbs planted by the previous owner of our home in years gone by have produced the beautiful flowers we enjoy each year. Each spring we are treated to a gorgeous display of tulip, daffodil, and lilies of the valley blossoms. The peonies have already produced an impressive number of large blossoms with an alluring aroma. The day lilies that line the back of the house; the hydrangea, roses, and hosta by the garage; and lilacs along the other side of the house are all preparing to bloom.

As I have witnessed the drama of nature's awakening again this year, I am reminded of how often Jesus compared God's reign in our hearts and lives to the growth and care of plants. He talked about mustard seeds, fig trees, vineyards, and seeds sown in a variety of soils. I also reflect on how naturally the bulbs and plants around our house have come to life. With a little sunlight and water they quickly began to grow, come into flower, and will eventually produce seeds and fruit. They are doing what God intends them to do.

What does all this talk of rain and sun, plants and blossoms, have to do with us and our lives of faith? Perhaps, it is as simple as this: we too have been created to blossom and produce fruit. We have been fashioned by a loving creator to give glory to God as we live lives of beauty and purpose. We give glory to God when we allow God's Word to penetrate to our very roots and the living water of the Spirit to hydrate our lives. We give glory to God when we allow the sunshine of God's presence to shine into our lives through prayer and meditation. We give glory to God when we pluck up the weeds of negativity and despair that would choke out the fruits of the Spirit. We give glory to God as we reach out to heal the hurts of our neighbors near and far in acts of caring and compassion. We give glory to God as we bear fruit that produces a rich harvest of love, joy, and peace in our lives and world.




