

Take a BREAK!

Come away to a deserted place all by vourselves and rest awhile. - Mark 6:30

Jesus commands his disciples to take a break from the demands of ministry. He instructs them to get away from the push and shove of their daily routines and to rest awhile. The Gospels capture the busy and demanding schedule that Jesus and his friends lived day in and day out. They were so busy that they often couldn't find time to eat without the demanding crowd intruding on their meals. So, Jesus commands them to rest and to get away from the press of the crowd to rejuvenate, renovate, and be restored.

From time to time, we all need to take a break. Even Jesus needed to take a break! Everyone needs some time for oneself. We need periodic moments, days, and weeks to be refreshed, renewed, and reinvigorated.

Do you remember the creation story in the first two chapters of Genesis? God labored six long days at the work of creation. At the end of the sixth day God looked with pleasure upon God's handiwork and declared creation "good." Then, on the seventh day, "God rested . . ." Even God needs to rest! So, do

we! That is why God gave us the Sabbath and commands us to rest.

In one of his sermons (Sabbath *Release*), the great United Methodist preacher, Bishop William Willimon tells of a woman he once knew "who took great pride that she had never, in her 20 years of work at a company, taken all of her vacation time. Year after year her vacation days accumulated but she never went on vacation. She considered her lack of time away from the office as a great virtue. Vacations? Those are for wimps who don't enjoy their work and who are always whining about how tired they are; not for good, sturdy stock like me!"

Bishop Willimon observes, "I'm afraid that in reality her failure to take vacations was a vice rather than a great virtue. She thereby showed that she had little life outside the office, that she thought that the company's entire fortunes rested solely on her sturdy, restless shoulders. It wasn't that she was so strong, so committed to her work that she did not need vacations. Rather, it was that she was vain, full of self-righteous pride, and self-absorbed."

Why is it that we follow Jesus' other commands: for instance; the commands to love our neighbor or to turn the other cheek, but not this command? Jesus commands us to take a

break! To be the persons God wants us to be we need to have the time and space to be renewed, reenergized, and restored.

In this newsletter you will find information about my vacation plans. I will be on vacation during July and August. I have some projects around our house to tackle. Paula and I have some daytrips planned. We have a longer trip to Chicago scheduled to visit the Institute of Art, one of our favorite museums. 
