

Countless Gifts of Love

In Luke 21, Jesus emphasizes giving from the heart, not as a legalistic expectation from God. "And He looked up and saw the rich putting their gifts into the treasury, and He saw also a certain poor widow putting in two mites. So He said, 'Truly I say to you that this poor widow has put in more than all; for all these out of their abundance have put in offerings for God, but she out of her poverty put in all the livelihood that she had." (Luke 21:1-4) were legally placing their tithe

The wealthy in this passage were legally placing their tithe in the offering plate. In Matthew 23:23, Jesus condemned the Pharisees for tithing seeds of mint, dill, and cumin. For every ten little seeds, they placed 10% or a single seed in the offering. It sounds silly. However, some approach the tithe legalistically, demanding

how much a person should give. Jesus never really stated that we had to "tithe 10%," but he also never said not to adhere to the Old Testament practice. In reality, in this passage of the widow, he focused on giving from the heart and

giving sacrificially. Her gift was the equivalent of \$1.88 today. In her day, this would have been the equivalent of her entire net worth. Truly a sacrificial gift. She responded out of gratitude for God's provision and God's love. Please do not misunderstand the message for today. No one is asked or expected to give their entire net worth. The message is to prayerfully

discern God's direction for my giving. The message is to respond out of gratitude. In 2 Corinthians 9:7, Paul states, "Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." The above provides guidance for when the church asks for donations. Prayerfully discern God's direction for when, what, and how much. It is never the same for everyone and may not require a response every time there is an appeal. You and God know your circumstances. Giving is as much a spiritual discipline as worship, prayer, Bible Study, and Christian Service. As an aside, the only topic Jesus talked about more than money and material

possessions was the Kingdom of God.

When comparing the widow to the wealthy, Jesus is not teaching equal gifts, but equal sacrifice. The response may be a small offering. The response may be a tithe of 10%. The response may be sacrificial well over the tithe.

When the widow gave her net worth, she had faith that God would provide. Never are we to put our life or family at risk with everything we have. That's not the message. But if we believe God calls us to give, and we reply faithfully, we have faith that God will provide.

Over the coming weeks, I will be sharing more about generosity, which entails time, talent, and treasure. I hope you participate as a means of growing in grace and knowledge of our relationship with God!
