

Lent: A Desert Journey

Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. He fasted forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was famished.

Matthew 4:1-2

Lent is a season that invites us on a sojourn through the desert. It is a time that beckons us to a pilgrimage in the wilderness. During Lent we walk in the footsteps of the Hebrews who wandered in the wilderness for forty years before entering the Land of Promise. We follow in the way of Jesus of Nazareth who was led by the Spirit from the River Jordan, the place of his baptism, into the Judean Wilderness where for forty days he was tempted to trade his identity and calling for a less arduous pathway. It was the arid wilderness of physical deprivation and soul-deep testing that prepared Jesus to live a life of devotion, courage, and merciful service to others. Deserts have much to teach us about vulnerability, tenacity, and the interdependence of living beings.

I invite you to join me on a desert journey during the Lenten Season. We will be using **Rachel M. Srubas's devotional,** *The Desert of Compassion* as our guide. The author draws on her life and learnings as a

contemplative pastor, spiritual director, and desert dweller to guide readers on a desert spiritual pilgrimage. The book provides daily Lenten sustenance for our journey inspired by Scripture, present-day insights, and personal experience. We will meet weekly via Zoom on six Thursdays in Lenten, at 7:00 p.m. We will begin on Thursday, February 23 and conclude on Thursday, March 30. > ▶ reaffirming our Baptismal vows **▶** the Sacrament of Holy Communion **▶** the imposition of ashes



Many thanks to all the teams who monthly have provided meals for Hope House on the 4<sup>th</sup> Friday. We are responsible for a main dish, which sometimes includes salad (depending on who is cooking). Menu is decided by the team of two or three people. They buy the ingredients and fix them either at the church or at Hope House. The meal is served at 4 p.m. by people at Hope House. We only provide the main meal but they often have desserts which we help cut and put on plates if we cook at Hope House. There is money in the budget for this. Receipts for the purchases are put into the offering plate on Sunday and sometime within the next two weeks the person who bought the food will be paid. No one is expected to use their own funds to do this service. I have asked many people to help with this and would like to hear from anyone who can help. It is work I enjoyed doing when I was more physically able but I am not strong enough to do the standing, lifting and stirring necessary so am grateful for the younger ones who carry on the tradition. Rev. Kirk Hudson who served our church was one of the founding fathers of this group and it has been one of our keystone mission projects through the years.


We're happy to report that in 2022 the impact to the community through this program.

## Minute for Mission

The Rescue Mission of Utica continues work to address Utica. It maintains an expanded 59 bed shelter for men clothing, referrals to social service agencies, and finds permanent housing for those seeking help. Within the last year it has opened a new, fully staffed, clean, safe, Drop-in Center at the West Street Apartments located on a bus line at 1013 West Street. It provides a wide array of services for disenfranchised individuals, both women and men, and is now open 24 hours/7days a week. Beyond meals, clothing, and a warn place off the streets, other examples of help available are: mental help recovery, peer support, healthcare, health insurance enrollment, housing applications, job applications, obtaining an ID, and more. This center has been endorsed and supported by the City of Utica and the county. You can obtain a one-page complete list of all the programs and services available from the Mission in the church office. There also are available "business cards" with phone numbers, extensions, and addresses, You might want to have one in your wallet or purse for quick reference or to give someone who approaches you needing help.
