

Opening Doors to Strangers

Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it. - Hebrews 13:2

For the last fifteen years I have served on the Board of Directors of The Center (formerly called The Mohawk Valley Resource Center for Refugees.) I became involved in refugee resettlement by accident. One Sunday twenty-five years ago a family of nine refugees from Burma walked through the doors of the church I was serving, Tabernacle Baptist Church. Soon our congregation was helping to welcome dozens of new friends from Burma each year.

I had no idea of the level of displacement and migration in our world until I met and became friends with refugees being resettled in Utica. Here are some eye-opening statistics about the scope of the worldwide refugee crisis:

- There are 108 million people worldwide who are refugees from their home countries.
- More than 1 in every 74 persons on earth has been forced to flee their homes.
- Currently, the majority of refugees come from three countries: Syria, Ukraine, and Afghanistan.

The United States began resettling refugees after World War II, when Congress passed legislation welcoming Europeans displaced by the war. In 1980, Congress passed the Refugee Act of 1980 and established the U.S. Refugee Admissions Program. Under this federal program, the President sets the number of refugees that are

admitted each year. In 2024 the U.S. pledged to receive 125,000. In Utica, we began welcoming refugees after the Vietnam War. We have welcomed over 20,000 refugees in the last twenty years, earning Utica the nickname, "The Town that Loves Refugees."

There is far more about our newest neighbors and the global refugee crisis than I can communicate in this short article. So, I invite you to join me at World Refugee Day on Saturday, May 8, 12:00 – 4:00 p.m. at the Jorgensen Athletic Center on the campus of Mohawk Valley Community College. It is a wonderful opportunity to meet some of our communities' newest neighbors, learn their stories, and have some fun.

The day begins with a **Naturalization Ceremony at Noon** as our neighbors from around the world become New Americans. **Hamdi Ulukaya, Chobani Founder and CEO**, who came to the U.S. as an immigrant from Türkiye will speak. He famously said, "The minute a refugee gets a job they stop being a refugee." Chobani is a major refugee employer.

The afternoon will also feature **Food Trucks** and **Vendors** offering international cuisine




