Holiday decorations and retail promotions started long before Thanksgiving. Culturally, we now are "IN THE SEASON." Lights are going up in our neighborhoods. Retail stores are decorated. The holiday season now begins with a shopping focus with Black Friday, Small Business Saturday, and Cyber Monday. Did you know the Sunday after Black Friday is sometimes called "Black Sabbath"? I find it ironic in this crazy season of decorating, shopping, parties, baking, etc. that the rock group Black Sabbath sang a song called Crazy Train. So, are you on the "Crazy Train" of the Holiday Season? We may want to consider that it is okay to silence some of the noise of the season for the better health of your heart, mind, and spirit.

The church calendar for the Holiday Season always begins with Advent. Advent means in Latin, "coming" or "prepare." Advent is intended as a time of preparation for the coming birth of the Christ Child. It is a time to prepare spiritually and emotionally for the celebration of the birth of Jesus. Research has found that the current craziness of the season has high expectations, which leads to increased stress, anxiety, and depression, loneliness and sadness, and financial pressures.

This past Sunday, the sermon was entitled "The Quiet Announcement." We were introduced to Zechariah. He was alone in the Holy Place of the Temple with Incense Offerings of prayers. Gabriel told him that he and Elizabeth would have a baby who would be named John. Ultimately, their son, John the Baptist, "prepared the way" for the coming of Jesus' ministry. Zechariah questioned Gabriel because he and Elizabeth were "advanced in years." Gabriel stated, "And now you will be silent and not able to speak until the day this happens, because you did not believe my words, which will come true at their appointed

time." (Luke 1:20) He was silent until John was born.

In a world of so much noise, we underrate solitude, stillness, and along time for reflection. Celebrate this Christmas Season. Shop to buy gifts for family and friends as an expression of love but do so within your current financial means. Decorate, but there is no need to light up the entire neighborhood. When preparing Christmas dinner, make enough for everyone, but not so much "you can feed an army." Go to parties, but be responsible. 


#### SEEKING HELP TO REFRESH OUR SOCIAL MEDIA
