## **LUKE**

Only Gospel **author whose identity is certain**. Physician. Traveling companion with Paul. Thus, met and heard from some of the original Disciples (Peter, James, and John – the Jerusalem Council).

Writing to Gentiles (but, unlike *Mark*, not to galvanize existing Church; unlike Paul, not to pastor churches; unlike *Matthew*, not to convince Hebrews that their long-awaited Messiah had arrived – thus, Sermon on the Plain, not the Mount; and unlike *John*, not to enter into theological discourse with Greek philosophical community) ... **Primarily to Romans in power**.

Two suggested meanings of "**Theophilus**" (a person – any person intrigued by theology). *Luke/Acts* may have originally been one book. *Acts 1* reads like a sequel. *Luke 24:50* (the Ascension), *Acts 1:1-11* (the beginning of The Way immediately following the Ascension). *Luke* = the Life of Jesus the Messiah; *Acts* = the Birth of The Church.

## **Romans Impressed by Power**

**BIRTH and RESURRECTION** accounts (*chapters 1 and 2*; *chapters 24:1-49*) These stories establish Divinely orchestrated bookends that set Jesus apart – thus giving increased credence to all that comes between those stories.

A Rome-friendly story (Zaccheus – 19:1-10)

**PARABLES** (Rabbinic method)
"A story (fiction) that conveys a moral truth."
