Call to order at 7:00 pm by Chairman Mark Sander, also present were Supervisors Jon Maker and Ray Wiggers

Minutes approved from January 12, 2026 with one clarification, motion/Mark, 2nd/Jon, all in favor

ROADS AND EQUIPMENT: Roadmaster ~ Plowed roads as needed, worked on trucks, replacing radiator on one of them and broken spring

OLD BUSINESS:

- None

NEW BUSINESS:

- Township entered CoStars pool for 2026-2027 salt contract, usually awarded after March 31
- Tax collector Anita Baker reported on 4th quarter 2025: She was successfully re-elected and sworn in on January 9, 2026; submitted bond renewal to county; 2025 unpaid bills submitted back to county for collection, two interim bills (one township/county, one school/library), 78 township/county and 87 school/library bills, dollar amounts similar to last four years; after first of the year, people are sending checks for 2025 taxes, letters sent telling them she's not able to accept them after January 1; also an issue with postmarks, because of delay in pickup or delivery to Pittsburgh for processing, postmarks could be days after payment is mailed; Anita encourages taxpayers to get payments in the mail at least a week before they are due, cannot backdate receipt of payment; Anita will prepare a release explaining all details closer to the tax payment dates; at this time she is unable to accept electronic payments; address changes ~ deed owners or persons with a POA are the only ones who can change an address in the tax records; asked to be reimbursed ½ for PA State Tax Collector dues (\$80) and ECTCC (\$15), total \$95; proposed going with USPS stamps again this year, more expensive to go with a company that provides bulk rate service (motion/Mark, 2nd/Ray, all in favor for dues and stamps)
- Zoning report for 2025 ~ 28 zoning permits issued, total \$1,225 fees

- Mr. Wellington questioned when supervisors voted to bid on a truck for sale in Waterford (December 22); Mark explained they discussed it in December, bid was due before next meeting; secretary explained no vote needed (Intergovernmental Exception) when bidding/buying directly from another township; Ray reported he researched pricing for a comparable truck, supervisors used that information to formulate a bid and submitted it
- Mr. Whitman asked if we were going to put one of our older trucks up for auction, no decision yet
