Minutes April 27, 2026

Call to order at 7:00 pm by Chairman Sander, also present was Supervisor Ray Wiggers, Supervisor Jon Maker was excused

Pledge to flag

Minutes approved from April 13, 2026, motion/Mark, 2nd/Ray, all in favor

ROADS AND EQUIPMENT: Grading of local roads, Thompson Road was ditched, routine maintenance of machinery and garage

ZONING AND BUILDING: One request for a new garage

CORRESPONDENCE: Hillcrest Drive residents contacted township about clumps of dirt and grass left in yard by plowing during winter, supervisors will visit the site; two Proctor Road residents contacted township about problems on the road, including a wing ditch that is no longer there, and questioning why we didn't brine after grading the road because there's a lot of dust

OLD BUSINESS:

- Zoning Ordinance amendment, supervisors approved wording for an ordinance change that allows ASTM F1236-9-approved pool covers to be installed in place of or in addition to fencing around an in-ground pool. Motion/Mark, 2nd/Ray
- Tire recycling event will be held this year in partnership with Concord Township and the city of Corry, on June 27, 2026 from 8 am to 1 pm at the Elgin-Beaverdam fire hall, limit 10 tires up to 24.5" per household (no rims) and tractor tires accepted between noon and 1 pm, no rims, it will be posted on our website and Facebook page

NEW BUSINESS:

- Township Tax Collector Anita Baker gave her quarterly tax report: As a qualified tax collector, credits have been taken care of and filed for this term; to maintain certified tax collector status she must have an additional 6 credits before the end of 2026; all reports were filed and accepted timely; bond limits were released for all tax collectors and may require two school reports in August/September and maybe October; hard deadline/cutoff for month-end dates were imposed by Erie County for tax payments by mail ~ if postmarks come in saying April 25 and are received on May 5 they must be returned; Anita encouraged taxpayers to mail early so the payments are on her desk by April 30, otherwise they will be returned
- Supervisors were asked to consider raising rates for some services offered by our tax collector in 2027, bringing them more in line with state norms, including permits for removing mobile homes and creating tax duplicates; they asked Anita to research rates and they will revisit in the fall, looking to include any changes with rate resolutions in January 2027
- Turnback agreement with Union Township is being revisited, supervisors asked secretary to find and update agreement and they will revisit at a future meeting

- Mr. Slagle asked if there was any resolution to a nuisance complaint discussed at the last meeting; Mr. Wellington asked if anything was happening with talks with the Corry Fire Department, was anything going on; Mr. Whitman asked supervisors if they were going to talk to/contact area townships/boroughs to participate in talks with the fire department; Mr. Whitman asked if there was anything new on a grant application submitted in 2025; Mr.

Hellyer asked about the procedure for getting a no-impact business zoning application in the future; Mr. Wellington commented that the tire recycling event used to be two days and there was always a pile of doughnuts
