### **Minutes February 23, 2026**

Call to order at 7:00 pm by Chairman Mark Sander, also present were Supervisors Jon Maker and Ray Wiggers

Pledge to flag

Minutes approved from February 9, 2026, motion/Mark, 2<sup>nd</sup>/Jon, all in favor

ROADS AND EQUIPMENT: Work done on trucks as needed, plowed and sanded as-needed, finished putting mower/tractor back together, routine PM

ZONING AND BUILDING: One permit for second-story addition to existing breezeway

CORRESPONDENCE: ETG Communications, outlining their current services and introducing themselves

OLD BUSINESS:

- None

NEW BUSINESS:

- TextMyGov, introduced to CREMA members by Lyn Wittmer/EMS coordinator; form of communication between municipalities and residents, costs based on population, estimate for Wayne Township \$3,000-\$4,000/year plus start-up costs the first year, requires 3-year contract; would allow residents to alert township of emergencies on their roads or in the township via website or text messages; supervisors were unanimous to pass on this idea, mostly because of cost
- Notified by PennDOT that after a 3-year pilot project for 2A modified aggregate (smaller top size of stone that would compact better on dirt roads and minimize stone loss), they are adding the 2A gravel to their Publication 227 Approved Products for LVLR for District 1 only; final approval still pending in approximately 3-5 months; PennDOT wants to know by February 26<sup>th</sup> if we are interested. Supervisors discussed, since we have already submitted and approved our gravel for this year, we would be interested in being kept in the loop for cost, minimum tons ordered, etc., and possibly joining the bidding in 2027 ~ Motion/Mark, 2<sup>nd</sup>/Jon, all in favor
- ECGRA grants ~ supervisors voted to apply for any available grants for machinery/upgrades/equipment ~ Motion/Mark, 2<sup>nd</sup>/Ray, all in favor
- Request for Action form discussed, would be added to website, any residents without internet access could pick up a copy in the office; would require residents to request in writing that the township look at properties that could potentially be violation of our nuisance and/or zoning ordinances; information would be kept confidential ~ Motion/Mark, 2<sup>nd</sup>/Jon, all in favor
- Update zoning and/or nuisance ordinances to add International Property Maintenance code guidelines to define (at least) minimum standards for what makes a house habitable; supervisors voted to have secretary draft suggestions and present them at a future meeting ~ Motion/Mark, 2<sup>nd</sup>/Ray, all in favor

- Mr. Wellington asked about the status of the township's comprehensive plan, Mark explained we were waiting to hear from our MAP grant application to help defray costs, the project is still going to happen
