Minutes, July 14, 2025

Call to order at 7:00 pm by Chairman Mark Sander, also present were supervisors Jon Maker and Mark Labowski

Minutes from June 23, 2025 approved ~ Motion to accept/Mark L, 2nd/Mark S ~ all in favor

ROADS AND EQUIPMENT: Logan ~ King Road, 052, Messenger, Sciota, Follett, Ladd, Steuart, Thompson, Proctor being graded this week; put gravel at intersection of Mill/Plank roads, resprayed weeds at guiderails and ditched on 052

ZONING AND BUILDING: (3) requests: one new home on Buffalo Rd., one addition to a garage on Hillcrest Drive and a permit to demolish a mobile home on Simmons Road

CORRESPONDENCE: Erie County Voter Registration office asking for notification of any resignations/changes to ballot; a thank you note from Loesel-Schaaf; membership information to join the Erie Area Council of Governments; and a synopsis of a new law passed by Congress recently affecting overtime

OLD BUSINESS:

- Vote to accept contract proposal and sign agreement with Environmental Planning and Design for new comprehensive plan was tabled, contingent on results of grant request to RDA
- Agility agreement with PennDOT for 2025 complete, representative will come to township building with sign-off sheet soon

NEW BUSINESS:

- Quarterly report from Anita Baker, township tax collector: Based on four years of information, increase in taxes coming in to the township since 2022 is about \$616.82, a lot of it due to construction, minus exonerations and demolitions. Paid and unpaid taxes at this time of year is about the same as last year, the addition of the street light fee to tax bills has been a big help
- Supervisors voted to sign Resolution 25-06, authorizing application to the Erie County MAP grant program, which would go toward drafting a new comprehensive plan ~ Motion/Mark S, 2nd/Jon, all in favor
- Amity/Wayne Township application for a new Multimodal Grant requires a resolution from the township; supervisors voted to sign Resolution 25-07 to authorize the joint application ~ Motion/Mark S, 2nd/Jon, all in favor
- Yearly Audit by Maloney/Reed/Scarpitti returned, township is in good shape
- The possibility of doing aprons in 2026 was discussed, maybe with funds from agility agreement; possibilities include Mill/Plank road intersection, Stateline at 426

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF VISITORS: Gerri Wellington, William Wellington, Anita Baker, Rebekah Wallace/Corry Journal

- Mr. Wellington reported the truck that was brining his road also put it on the city's tar and chip portion of the road; supervisors asked the roadmaster to contact the company to work out how to compensate the township for the misapplied brine
- Mr. Wellington asked if the township ever tries to get businesses to locate in the industrial park and is there a tax rebate on the township's part
