

## **WAYNE TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS Minutes March 23, 2026**

Call to order at 7:00 pm by Vice-Chairman Maker, also present was Supervisor Ray Wiggers, Supervisor Mark Sander was excused

Pledge to flag

Minutes approved from March 9, 2026, motion/Jon, 2<sup>nd</sup>/Ray, all in favor

**ROADS AND EQUIPMENT:** Roadmaster: salted/sanded roads as-needed, took township 1998 truck to auction, worked on the grader (oil, filters), waiting on filters for tractor, normal maintenance and shop upkeep, sinkhole on Stuart Rd filled with gravel; supervisor Wiggers asked about situation with frost on dirt roads (normal thawing), and about condition of guardrails in the township, after receiving an email from PennDOT about keeping up on maintenance ~ roadmaster reported the only one in our township that merits concern at present is located on Sciota Road (others are in relatively good shape), new rails on Mill Road when new bridge installed; supervisor Maker asked if guardrails all have rounded ends on them (roadmaster said yes)

**ZONING AND BUILDING:** One request for 30x56 storage building

### **OLD BUSINESS:**

- PennDOT Route 6 project ~ Supervisors clarified the section of Route 6 being worked on this summer
- Conservancy land acquisition ~ Anticipating creating a graveled parking area for 3-5 cars in Wayne Township portion, posting the land around the property lines, no trails will be built
- Gravel for roads and grant options ~ Secretary researched options, no free gravel for roads, two grant options available, one of which is for maintaining trails and portions of road where no trails are available (roads that connect trails); concerns voiced by supervisors included liability if the township opens roads to ATVs; subject tabled for future discussion

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- Discussion of installing a new sluice pipe on Stateline Road, between 426 and Buffalo Road, to replace existing 18" concrete pipe; water backed up when snowmelt began this year, it couldn't handle flow and property nearby was flooded, should be replaced with larger pipe at or above spot

- Mr. Wellington talked to Sgt. Walton at the Corry PSP about ATVs on roads, who advised him of things we already know; he also asserted that no matter where grants are coming from, it's all PennDOT money for the trails, and that money comes from taxes at gas pumps
- Mr. Whitman asked who would be responsible/liable if an ATV hit a guardrail
- Mr. Wellington voiced concern about who would be responsible if an ATV hit a resident or vehicle backing out of a driveway
