

WAYNE TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS

Minutes March 9, 2026

Call to order at 7:00 pm by Chairman Mark Sander, also present were Supervisors Jon Maker and Ray Wiggers

Pledge to flag

Minutes approved from February 23, 2026, motion/Mark, 2nd/Ray, all in favor

ROADS AND EQUIPMENT: Salted and sanded roads as needed, evaluated the 1998 truck for any repairs; new garage door installed to replace broken one; working on installing new teeth on grader blades, cost was over \$1,400 for parts; inspected frost damage to a spot on Stuart road, ordered/deposited tri-axle load of oversize gravel for that area, also tri-axle load at far end of road near Carter Hill and topped both with 2RC, rest of road OK; evaluated roads for ditching in the spring; starting to service equipment for summer; normal maintenance and shop upkeep; supervisor Sander asked Logan to schedule time to cut branches back on shady spots on roads

ZONING AND BUILDING: None

CORRESPONDENCE: PennDOT traffic counts on local roads between March 2026 and November 2026 (Buffalo, Russell and Sciota Roads); new rates for inbound and outbound notifications in the PA OneCall system

OLD BUSINESS:

- Joint Enterprise eGrant Multimodal Transportation Fund grant request with Amity Township to pave Fenno Road was rejected again this year
- The township's 1998 truck – getting it ready for auction including new batteries, needs power steering reservoir, no plow attached; Recommendation: keep equipment we have including plows (spreader can go in back of yellow truck); Supervisors voted to send the township's 1998 truck to auction in April, instructed roadmaster to prepare it for delivery; appropriate advertising will be done ahead of time; Motion/Mark, 2nd/Jon, Ray abstained

NEW BUSINESS:

- PennDOT project ~ as presented by PennDOT, Route 6 from Warren County to somewhere near Elgin Borough line, .67 miles, passes through Corry and Wayne Township; some confusion about wording in PennDOT advisory about length of roadwork in township and total overall length of work, labeling of Route 6 with three different names; asked secretary to contact PennDOT and get clarifications; township does have some suggestions to add to the project
- Township received 2026 liquid fuels (\$120,851.14) and turnback (\$6,600) funds
- Western PA Conservancy notified township they have acquired land in Wayne and Concord Townships for the protection of the French Creek watershed; asking the township for a letter of recommendation for a grant they are applying for; after some discussion, the supervisors have a few questions before writing the letter
- Supervisors voted to advertise for brine bids, Motion/Mark, 2nd/ Jon, all in favor
- Mark reported that the township has received inquiries about allowing ATV's on township roads, and people have heard that PA is strongly advocating municipalities to allow them, and there might be some grant money available/or free gravel to help maintain roads; Supervisors would like to know if any municipalities are already doing this; one revenue

suggestion is to owners would pay for a sticker (permit to be able to ride roads from township); Mr. Wellington asked who would enforce any rules for ATVs and noted if the vehicles are 4-WD they pull stones out of the road; biggest concern is people creating noise/vandalism issues late at night and police enforcement; secretary will research if there is a free gravel program in the state/county
