# HISTORIAN'SREPORT

Kerry Parker was the Tri-County ASHRAE chapter President during the 2000-2001 year. He provided excellent leadership during that time for the chapter. He also has served Tri County as the chapter Research Promotion Chair and chapter Historian.

Kerry is currently the Managing Principal Vice President at TMAD Taylor and Gaines in Ontario. He has been with TMAD for 29 years. I recently met with Kerry to detail some of his earlier years and various ASHRAE experiences.

JIM TODA: Tell us about your life away from work.


