

PRESENTATION TOPIC


"A technical reference to VAV, CAV, VAD system concepts and general applications for various climate zones part I." This presentation is brought to you by Thomas Podgurski, Group Director at Royal Service. The presentation includes several drawing samples to help illustrate the various system configurations and thought process involved for each, with discussion around control strategies and plenty of opportunity to dive into the technical details behind each of the system types listed below:

- VAV- Variable air volume
- CAV- Constant air volume Valves. Mechanical and electrical
- VAD- Variable air volume diffusers.

AHU1 System



ASHRAE CO2 recommendation Set-point 600ppm less then OSA PPM.

19, IAQ Fresh Air Volume Control:

CO₂ Sensor+ Fresh Air/Return Air Volume Damper or exhaust fan Control CO₂ required setting from ASHRAE is 600PPM less Outside PPM AVG CO₂ overrides all other control demand Normal setting (500-1000PPM)
