

ADVANCED SNIPER/OBSERVER TEAM OPERATIONS COURSE (TIER III-IV)

COURSE: Advanced Sniper/Observer Team Operations (ASOTO-C)

19-23 Feb 2018 @ the ISOTF, Altha Fl/Hosted-presented by the TATSOR Group

PURPOSE: To teach selected personnel the skills necessary to enable them to operate as members of a Sniper/Observer Team (SOT) utilizing TATSOR Group TIER III-IV level skill sets in order to support tactical operations within an urban and rural environment. The training will include but not be limited to:

- Review of SOT Operations
- Review of SOT Equipment
- Review of Field-Craft
- Review of Site Orientation System/Reporting Procedures
- TIER III-IV SOT Tactics-Techniques-Procedures (TTP)
- TIER III-IV Tactical Precision Marksmanship
- SOT-Assaulter Integrated Operations
- Tactical Law Enforcement Decision Making Process (TLEDMP)-SOT Specific
- Specialty Target Interdiction (Solid Mediums-Vehicles)
- Live Fire Scenario application of all learned skills

PRE-REQUISITES: Member of a military, law enforcement or correction organization with a minimum basic level sniper/observer skill set with a requirement for follow-on skills training in Sniper/Observer Team Operations.

SPECIAL INFORMATION: The Advanced Sniper/Observer Team Operations Course (ASOTO-C/TIER III-IV) is performance-oriented training conducted in a medium to high-risk environment. To successfully complete the course a student must be in **TOP** physical and mental condition, progress through increasingly difficult training requirements and achieve a minimum 80% academic average. The ASOTO-C/TIER III-IV has numerous live fire exercises, classroom lectures/conferences and graded, must complete blocks of instruction.

CLASS DURATION/SIZE/TUITION: Program is 5 days (60+ hours) with a maximum class size of 18 personnel. Tuition is **\$450.00** per attendee and includes lodging on the facility if desired.
