



PATROL OFFICER TACTICS COURSE (POTC I)

COURSE: Patrol Officer Tactics Course (POTC I)

18-20 March/29-31 May/2-4 Oct 2019 @ the ISOTF, Altha FI

SCOPE: To teach the Patrol Officer the skills required to operate in a high-risk event environment versus the active assailant-shooter. Based upon the curriculum of the Tactical Team Active Assailant-Shooter Course this program is specifically designed to prepare personnel for tactical close quarters (room entry) situations as well as highlight and reinforce tactical shooting and patrol rifle tactics, techniques and procedures versus the active assailant-shooter. Training includes; Officer psychology; Active assailant shooter-high risk events case studies; Response to active assailant shooter-high risk events tactics, techniques and procedures; Patrol rifle introduction; Tactical marksmanship with the issue handgun and patrol rifle; Open air tactics (OAT); Tactical methods of entry breaching (TMOEB); Officer tactical medical introduction (IFAK/self-buddy aid). Training also includes room combat/CQB covering all specialty areas with emphasis upon singleton/individual clearing techniques, personnel handling techniques, introduction to dynamic breaching, response to active assailant shooter techniques and a variety of normal/reduced visibility training scenarios, dry and live fire. **POTC I includes live fire validation of all personnel and TTPs in a confined space-interior environment.**

PRE-REQUISITES: The Patrol Officer Tactics Course I is program one of three offered POTC programs and emphasizes law enforcement operations for the patrol officer operating in various high-risk environments versus the current threats (criminal and terrorist) of the twenty first century. Attendees should be sworn law enforcement/corrections officers, military personnel and/or security personnel. Each attendee must be proficient as per their respective departments patrol rifle qualification policy and have their respective weapon battle sight zeroed to them prior to attendance.

SPECIAL INFORMATION: The Patrol Officer Tactics Course (POTC I) is performance-oriented training conducted in a medium to high-risk environment. To successfully complete the course a student must be in GOOD physical and mental condition. POTC I has numerous live fire exercises, classroom lectures/conferences and graded must complete blocks of instruction.

NOTE: Attendance at the Patrol Officer Tactics Course I does not mandate an attendee will graduate. Each attendee must meet and/or exceed course standards in order to receive a completion diploma. Those who do not will receive a certificate of attendance.

CLASS SIZE/DURATION TUITION: Maximum class size is 24. Minimum class size is 12. Duration is 3 days/36+ hours. Course cost is \$350.00 per attendee.
