

Congratulations to Ahmed Rafi (known as Rafi), our FoLL Board Member, on attaining a PhD in Public Affairs from the University of Texas at Dallas in May 2025.

Rafi and his family have been Lakewood residents since 1986. Their children, Muhammad and Sarah, attend Craig William Elementary and Mayfair High Schools in Lakewood.

Rafi is passionate about teaching and learning, and loves volunteering, civic engagement, and community service. He has also volunteered at the local polling stations as a clerk for Los Angeles County in almost every election since 1990. He has been an active neighborhood watch captain since 1986 and was awarded the Neighborhood Watch Captain of the Year in 2016.
