
### A TASTE OF SPOOKY FUN-SCARE-CUTERIE

SCARE-CUTERIE- Charcuterie, snacks, nibbles and boards with a spine-tingling twist combines two of my favorite things: cooking and Halloween. I've always loved cooking. It's my creative outlet, a way to relax, and a way to bring family and friends together. And Halloween? That's my absolute favorite holiday. I love the costumes, decorations, the playfulness, and the chance to celebrate in a spooky way is a ton of fun for me! So, writing this cookbook was the perfect way to bring those passions together.

SCARE-CUTERIE is filled with over 45 eerie spreads packed with over 85 deliciously spooky recipes, each packed with layers of flavor, clever plating and festive garnishes. Everything from grazing boards, crudites, fruit and cheese platters, dessert and candy boards, snack boards, and even bread and butter boards, there's a spooky spread for everyone. One of my favorite recipes is my Baked Zom-BRIE. An ooey gooey baked brie topped with a bloody balsamic strawberry compote and a puff pastry zombie face. The real fun begins when your guests start to devour it, transforming it into an even more gruesome zombie. My Devilish Egg Board is another favorite of mine. It features five spooky varieties, from Miso Mummies, Beelzebub Eggs, Blue Moon Eggs, Zom-brains, and Spider Eggs. This Halloween appetizer board is a definite crowd-pleaser.

Putting this cookbook together has been a dream come true and I'm so proud of how it turned out. As a local author, it means so much to share this milestone with my community and I'm very excited to see people cooking from it and maybe even starting new Halloween traditions of their own. SCARE-CUTERIE will be in stores on August 26, 2025 and is available for preorder. 
