

## Shadow Project emerges out of the "Shadows" to win two 2022 USATF Masters Indoor National Championship Titles at the Armory in New York City

Washington DC based Shadow Project— an Elite Masters Track Club focused on middle distance track with the goal to develop USATF and AAU Masters National Champions and Medalists to become medal contenders at Masters Athletics World Championships - delivered it first two National Champions in their debut USATF Masters National Championship event.

Mark Neff (60-64) won the 3000M race in 10:23.1 by a significant margin over his competition. Spectators commented on his calm and cool race domination, leading it from wire to wire. This was Shadow Project's first USATF National Championship title and happened in their debut USATF meet. This set the tone for the remainder of the weekend with emotions and comradery at an all-time high.

New 1500 specialist **Scott Wallace** (40-44), achieved an impressive result, 4:33.99. Scott, wearing the Shadow Project singlet for the first time, showed his dedication and talent against a star-studded field.

Other results included a bronze medal by Mark Neff (60-64) in the mile.

The remainder of the team **Jason Abbot** (40-44), **James Coates** (40-44) and **Mark Walchinsky** (40-44) had impressive results in very competitive heats to obtain personal bests as Master's runners in the 400 through the mile with top finishes overall.
