
I look forward to getting to know your children and supporting them in their development while working with all of you to make their time here as positive and enriching as possible.


Thank you for entrusting us with your child's care and education. We're excited for the season ahead and all the growth and joy it will bring.



A Message from the Infant Team












A message from the School Age Program

- OPEN PE Games: Incorporating the OPEN PE curriculum has added fun, teamwork, and active play to our days. These games are a hit with students and staff alike!


Exciting Plans Ahead





















Pyramid Model Tip: Supporting Positive Behaviors

Young children often use behaviors to express their needs, emotions, or frustrations, especially when they lack the words to communicate effectively. As caregivers, we can support positive behaviors by teaching and modeling appropriate ways to express feelings.
