



cabinet care & cleaning

Polish/Wax

Neither! Your cabinets don't need it nor do we recommend it! Polishes and wax can leave a build up that is difficult to remove. You'll thank us later.

Fight Dust/Dirt

Usually, a clean, soft cotton or microfiber cloth dampened with warm water will do the trick. Mild dishwashing liquid (not dishwasher products) will take care of dirt and grease. 1 to 20 is a good ratio for soap to water.

Wet Towels

We know it's convenient, but don't drape wet towels or cloths over your cabinet doors. Moisture can cause permanent damage (discoloration or peeling) to the cabinet finish.

Avoid

- Products to avoid
- + harsh detergents, strong soaps, multi-purpose and abrasive cleaning products
- + sponges or dirty cloths that contain particles that could scratch your cabinets
- + paper towels due to the ease of scratching
- + mineral spirits, nail polish removers, or paint thinners

Spills

Make sure to wipe spills up quickly! Then clean as necessary with mild dishwashing soap or warm water. Exposure to grease, oil, food, water and liquid can cause permanent damage or discoloration.
