In the Lord's Supper, the Risen Christ is at once the Giver and the Gift! By His promise His very Body and Blood are present; and thereby we come into the very presence of the exalted Christ! As we do so, witness is also given to the oneness in the profession of faith of those who receive the Sacrament together - and in this way we support and encourage one another in the struggle of giving faithful witness to our Christian faith and our trust in all of God's Word. For this reason, we practice close communion and invite all who profess the Christian faith that is confessed by Grace Lutheran Church (LC-MS) to commune with us. Helpful preparation is located on pages 329-330 of our hymnal (LSB). If you have any questions we ask that you speak with the pastor or one of the elders. Please note that children are welcome to come forward for a blessing. If not communing, please fold your arms.

PLEASE NOTE: Gluten free wafers are available on the altar (in a small clear plastic container - orange lid). Inform the elder of your desire to receive gluten free -you will have opportunity to reach into container for the wafer.

ALSO NOTE: Alcohol-free fruit of the vine (grape juice) is available in the very center slot of the communion tray. Pastor will work to always have one cup available. (These options are offered for those with medical conditions, etc., where these options are helpful or even necessary.)
