PLEASE NOTE: Gluten free wafers are available on the altar (in a small clear plastic container - orange lid). Inform the elder of your desire to receive gluten free - you will have opportunity to reach into container for the wafer. **ALSO NOTE: Alcohol-free fruit of the vine (grape juice)** is available in the very center slot of the communion tray. Pastor will work to always have one cup available.
