"My son will be 4 in July. He goes to a local KinderCare daycare facility. I want to put him in a learning environment that, I feel and know, has his BEST self in mind. I am a single divorced dad and funding for his schooling and maturation would be a blessing. Re-configuring my wallet post-divorce is essential to providing a stable home."



School entrepreneur

"The primary reason that I need support is to acquire a rental space and to purchase items (i.e shelves, baskets/trays and work materials) to begin a parent-child Montessori program with a focus on infant mental health in my area. As of today, there are no Montessori programs in my immediate area, thus creating a need that should be filled. I currently work as an infant/toddler lead at a Montessori school, but I have a strong passion to educate parents/caregivers from similar backgrounds as myself on the Montessori philosophy and to help them began to be empowered in caring for their young families. My plan is to use parent-child classes as phase one of my Montessori entrepreneur journey. The aim for the next phase is to start an authentic infant/toddler Montessori program for socioeconomically disadvantaged families."

"I recently graduated from graduate school and have dedicated my life to teaching, the arts, and community organizing. I made \$11 an hour as a preschool teacher in my hometown. During that time. I was humbled as to how the stressful life of a Black person in today's world can impact their health, finances, and the actualization of their dreams and liberation. I cannot afford AMI training and my Montessori center will cover 1/3 of the \$13,250 price for AMI training. There is a \$1,000 fee to hold a spot. These fees are not so friendly for particularly low-income Black educators and students so I am so grateful that I am able to even write in to apply for BMEF."



International

"The indigenous Batwa (Twa) community of Gicumbi and Byumba in Rwanda families struggle to access education. 38% of children "are stunted, preventing them from reaching their full potential in cognitive, motor, language and socioemotional skills" and only 18% of children aged 3-6 have opportunities to attend pre-school programmes or early learning facilities. The funds would allow for 47 children between 2-6 years old to receive transformative educational experiences, support their development and help them to access and take advantage of opportunities in the longer term."
