Frequently Asked Questions

What is a Junior Firefighter?

A Junior Firefighter is a young volunteer, aged 14-18, who learns important skills while helping their community. They support our team during fire calls and gain hands-on experience in firefighting.

Who should consider becoming a Junior Firefighter?

Anyone interested in helping their community and learning about firefighting should consider joining. Our fire company includes people from various backgrounds and careers. Many of our leaders started as Junior Firefighters.

What is the time commitment?

Junior Firefighters are encouraged to join our weekly training sessions, held on Mondays at 7:00 p.m. They can also choose to respond to fire calls when available.

Is it safe?

Yes, safety is our top priority. Junior Firefighters participate in training under supervision. They follow state laws and our policies, which restrict their activities at fire scenes. For example, they are not allowed inside burning buildings or on highways during accidents.

What are the requirements?

Junior Firefighters must keep at least a C average in school. They need medical clearance, Act 153 background checks, and permission from a parent or guardian.
