Objective:

Age Group: Key Stage 2 Duration: 1.5 hours

Links to National Curriculum:

- Science: Learn about life cycles of plants and their importance to the environment.
- Geography: Explore how human activities impact ecosystems.

Activity Plan:

1. Sustainable Gardening Tour (30 minutes):

- Explore the nursery's sustainable practices (composting, water conservation, using native plants).
- o Observe wildlife-friendly gardening features like pollinator-friendly flowers.

2. Hands-On Task (40 minutes):

- Pupils create a "mini wildlife garden" in small trays using soil, stones, and native plants.
- o Include elements like a water source or insect hideaways.

3. Discussion and Reflection (20 minutes):

Discuss how gardening supports biodiversity and reduces environmental impact.

- Pupils develop practical gardening skills and a deeper understanding of sustainability.
- Activities encourage curiosity, critical thinking, and actionable steps toward environmental stewardship.
